1868

This day commences with a light Breeze from South with clear weather ship upon dipnet tacks middle and latter part the same so ends the day

This day commences with a fine Breeze from South with clear weather ship upon dipnet tacks saw 2 sails middle and latter part the same so ends the day

This day commences with a fine Breeze from S. with clear weather ship heading S East middle and latter part the same saw 4 sails so ends the day

This day commences with a fine Breeze from S with clear weather ship upon dipnet tacks middle and latter part the same so ends the day

Friday June 21

This day commences with a fine weather ship heading dipnet course middle part the same latter part fine Breeze from S ship heading S. saw 3 sails so ends the day

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Monday June 22

1868

This day commences with a strong Breeze from South with cloudy weather ship upon dipnet tacks middle part the same latter heading S East saw 4 sails so ends the day

Tuesday June 23

This day commences with a fine Breeze from W. S. West with clear weather ship upon dipnet tacks at 4 a heavy squally lasted about one hour middle and latter part light variable winds so ends the day

This day commences with a light air and calm with cloudy weather ship upon dipnet tacks. Several sail in sight. Middle and latter part the same. So ends this day.

This day commences with light variable wind, ship upon different courses. Several sail in sight. At 12 1/4 P. M. saw Blackbird, lowered away and the Harbord struck and brought fish alongside. Men employed in cutting the fish. middle and latter part strong squally of rain ship upon dipnet tacks so ends the day
