

Remarks on Board Bark Matlapissett of
Tuesday July 14 1865

This day commences a fine Breeze from
South with clear weather ship upon
distant tack middle and latter part
the same saw sails so ends the day

Sat by Lt 30.55
Ten by Com 77.53

Wednesday July 15

This day commences with a light variable
winds ship upon distant tack middle and
latter part light winds and calm saw
3 sails so ends the day

Sat by Lt 30.40
Ten by Com 75.11

Thursday July 16

This day commences with light variable
wind and calm weather middle and latter
part the same so ends the day

Sat by Lt 31.12
Ten by Com 75.19

Friday July 17

This day commences with a light Breeze
S.W. with clear weather ship heading S.E.
Middle part the same. At 25 minutes past 5 A.M.
Frank fired full of the fore topmast cross trees and
was instantly killed. He was a native of the
Western Islands. Latter part ship heading
N.E. so ends the day

Saturday July 18

This day commences with light variable
winds ship heading N.E. at 4 P.M.
Barack Frank near middle part calm
at 6 it in saw sperm whales toward
the boats so ends the day

Sunday July 19 1865

This day commences with fine Breeze
from N.E. with clear weather Boats in
chase of whales the barbed Boat went
a long side of but the iron did
not go in came on board at usual down
middle part light Breeze latter part fine
Breeze from N.E. ship heading E saw
9 sails so ends the day

Sat by Lt 31.10
Ten by Com 77.02

Monday July 20

This day commences with a light Breeze
from N.E. with clear weather ship heading
upon distant tack middle and latter
part the same saw a number of sails
so ends the day

Sat by Lt 31.11
Ten by Com 76.44

Tuesday July 21

This day commences with a light Breeze
from S.W. with clear weather ship upon
distant tack middle part the same
latter part strong Breeze so ends the day

Sat by Lt 31.30
Ten by Com 77.11

Wednesday July 22

This day commences with a strong Breeze
from S.W. with thick cloudy weather
ship heading S.W. Several sails in sight.
Middle and latter part the same. So ends
this day.

Sat by Lt 31.02
Long 76° 37' W.
