

Remarks on Board Bark Mattapoisett of
Sunday Aug 23 1868

This day commences with light variable
wind and calm ship heading it or to
N.E. at 4 P.M. made the land middle
part of Long Island distant 14 miles.
Middle part calm, latter part light breeze
from S.W. ship heading E.N.E. Good
many sail in sight. At 8 A.M. spoke
steaming "Philip" of N. York. To end
this day.

Monday, Aug. 24th

This day commences with a light breeze
from S.W. with clear weather. Ship under
all sail and heading. Eby N. A good many
sail in sight. At sundown Long Isl. 7 miles
distant, bearing North. Middle and latter part
light breeze and calm. To end this day.

Tuesday Aug. 25.

This day commences with a light breeze from
S.W. with clear weather. Ship under all
sail and heading E.N.E. Several sail in
sight At sundown Long Isl. 7 miles
distant, bearing North. Middle and latter
part land in sight. To end this day.

Wednesday, Aug. 26.

This day commences with a fine breeze from
S.W. with clear weather. Ship under all sail
and heading about E.N.E. Land in sight,
and several sail. Came to an anchor at 2 P.M.
of the old buck light. Took up the anchor and got
under way at 8 A.M. Light breeze from S.W.
Ship upon different tacks To end this day.

Thursday, Aug. 27.

This day commences with a fine breeze from
S.W. with clear weather. Ship heading different
tacks. Took the ship alongside the wharf at
3 1/2 P.M. Middle and latter part laying to
an anchor. To end this day and voyage.
