

Remarks from Westport to the Charleston

Saturday May 1st

Begins with Moderate gales from the East with Cloudy weather the Course N. S. W. middle part wind wind hauls south with fresh gales latter part strong gales with Cloudy weather

Sunday May 2^d

Begins with strong gales from the S. W. with heavy squalls ship heading N. N. W. under Close reef top sails fore sail in sight at 7 P.M. were ship, middle and latter part blowing a gale from the S. W. with Clear weather ship heading S. S. E. under Close reef main top sail and fore Course

Monday May 3^d

Begins with a gale from the west with Clear weather with a heavy sea ship heading South under Close reef main top sail and fore Course middle and latter part wind and weather the same the pumps attended to find the ship making a small leak of one hundred strokes in twenty four hours one sail in sight

Tuesday May 4th

Begins with a gale from the west with Clear weather the ship lying to under Close reef main top sail and fore Course heading South middle part blowing very heavy from the N. W. took in the fore Course latter part more moderate made sail as required one sail in sight

Lat 31.40 Long 73.30

Ground Weston & Tripp Master 18.69

Wednesday May 5th

Begins with strong gales from the west with Clear weather heading S. S. W. under Close reef top sails middle and latter part more moderate made sail as required saw one sail

Lat 30.35 Long 73.18

Thursday May 6th

Begins with fresh gales from the S. W. with Clear weather heading South ship under single reef top sails at 1 P.M. tacked ship at sunset heading N. W. well and latter part wind and weather the same saw two sail

Friday May 7th

Begins with strong gales from S. W. with Clear weather heading N. W. under Close reef main top sail and fore Course saw one sail at sunset were ship and headed S. S. E. tried the pumps found a small leak of about one hundred strokes in twenty four hours latter part light airs and calm the watch employed fitting Boats

Saturday May 8th

Begins with light airs and calm at 6 P.M. took a thunder squall from the South middle part heavy rain with thunder latter part fresh gales from the N. W. with Clear weather ship heading N. S. W. under single reef top sails saw two sail
