

Remarks Cruising on Charleston Ground

Sunday May 9th

Begins with fresh gales from the N.W. with Clear weather heading W.S.W. under single reefed sails and fore Course one sail in sight Middle part the same latter wind and weather the same at 6.30 a.m. passed a whaling Schooner and 11 a.m. passed a whaling Bark

Monday May 10th

Begins with fresh gales from the North with Clear weather Ship heading N.N.W. under short sail at sunset Shortened sail and sent Boats Crew watches Middle and latter part calm

Tuesday May 11th

Begins with a calm at 4 P.M. toward the Boats and took the Boats Crew latter part moderate gales from the S.E. with Clear pleasant weather steering N.W. three sail in sight

Wednesday May 12th

Begins with moderate gales from the S.E. with Clear pleasant weather steering N.W. at sunset shortened sail luffed by the wind latter part fresh gales with Clear weather steering N.W. three sail in sight

Thursday May 13th

Begins with strong gales from the S.E. with heavy weather ship heading S.W. at 4 P.M. reefed down at sunset furled fore top sail and wore ship one sail in sight Middle part blowing a gale from the South latter part blowing heavy with thunder squalls ship heading S.E. under reefed main top sail and fore Course took the pumps in sail in sight

Friday May 14th

Begins with strong gales from the S.E. with passing squalls ship heading S.E. at sunset calm with a heavy sea one sail in sight Middle and latter part strong gales with Clear weather the pumps attended to one sail in sight

Saturday May 15th

Begins with strong gales from the W.S.W. with Clear weather ship under reefed main top sail and fore Course heading South at 4 P.M. spoke the ship Robert Edwards of New Bedford Alanders master at sunset Close reefed the main top sail Middle and latter part more moderate one sail in sight

Sunday May 16th

Begins with moderate gales from the West with Clear weather ship under all sail heading S.E. at 4 P.M. tacked ship at sunset shortened sail three sail in sight Middle and latter part fresh gales from the S.W. with Clear weather ship heading N.W. under all sail one sail in sight

Monday May 17th

Begins with fresh gales from the S.W. with Clear weather ship under all sail heading W.N.W. three sail in sight at sunset shortened sail and tacked ship Middle part heading S.S.E. latter part heading N.W. with Clear pleasant weather
