Tuesday May 18th

Begins with moderate gales from the S.W. with Clear weather Ship heading N.N.W. at sunset Shortened sail and tacked ship. Middle part heading S.S.E. at Daylight Made all sail at 6 a.m. tacked ship ends with moderate gales ship heading N.W.

Wednesday May 19th

Begins with fresh gales from the S.W. with passing Clouds ship under all sail heading west at 4 P.M. saw Grampasses at sunset shortened sail and tacked ship. Two sail in sight. Middle part strong gales from the S.W. with rain squalls ship heading S.S.E. latter part wind and weather the same.

Begins with strong gales from the N.N.W. with Cloudy weather ship heading S.W. under reefed topsails at 4 P.M. saw black fish latter part Calm

Begins with light Breezes from the N.E. with Clear pleasant weather steering S.W. at sunset shortened sail. latter part steering N.W. at 10 a.m. spoke the schooner Union of Port Haven Irish Master 8 months out with 10 Barrels ends with fine weather Ship under all sail heading S.W. Two sail in sight

Saturday May 22nd

Begins with fresh gales from the S.W. with Clear pleasant weather ship heading west at 2 P.M. saw bracks and 4 tered for them saw them no more at 4 P.M. spoke the schooner Union Capt. Fisher at sunset tacked ship. Middle part heading S.S.E. latter part Strong gales from the S.W. with passing thunder squalls ship under reefed sails heading S.S.E. Three sail in sight

Sunday May 23rd

Begins with fresh gales from the S.W. with Clear weather ship heading S.S.E. under reefed sails at sunset shortened sail. Middle part took a squall from the N.W. latter part Strong gales from the S.W. with Clear weather ship heading N.N.W. under short sail

Monday May 24th

Begins with strong gales from the N.N.W. with Clear weather ship heading west under reef main topsail and fore Course at 8 a.m. tacked ship. latter part moderate gales from the N.N.W. with Clear weather ship heading N.E. Two sail in sight

Lat 30.25 Long 76.12

Tuesday May 25th

Begins with moderate gales from the N. with Clear weather ship heading E.N.E. under all sail at sunset shortened sail one sail in sight. Middle and latter part Calm one sail in sight
