W. with Clear pleasant weather ship heading N. W. one sail in sight

Begins with moderate gales from the N. Y. W. with Clear weather ship under all sail heading N. W. at sunset shortened sail one sail in sight middle and latter part wind and weather the same one sail in sight

Begins with moderate gales from the N. Y. W. with Clear pleasant weather ship under all sail heading N. W. at 4 P.M. tacked ship at sunset shortened sail middle and latter part wind and weather the same latter part heading N. N. W. one sail in sight

Saturday May 29th

Begins with moderate gales from the N. Y. W. with Clear pleasant weather ship heading N. W. at sunset shortened sail for the night middle and latter part wind and weather the same one sail in sight

Begins with moderate gales from the N. Y. E. with Clear pleasant weather ship under all sail heading S. W. one sail in sight at sunset shortened sail middle and latter part moderate gales from the N. Y. W. ship heading S. E. two sails in sight

Monday May 31st

Begins with light airs from the N. Y. E. with Clear pleasant weather ship under all sail heading East at sunset shortened sail and were ship one sail in sight middle and latter part heading S. W. the steward off duty

Tuesday June 1st

Begins with moderate gales from the N. Y. E. with Clear pleasant weather ship under all sail heading N. N. E. at sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind heading E. N. E. latter part stood off N. W. two sails in sight

Wednesday June 2nd

Begins with fresh gales from the N. Y. E. with Clear weather ship under all sail heading N. W. at sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind heading E. N. E. eight sails in sight middle part the same latter part fresh gales from the N. Y. E. with passing squalls one sail in sight

Thursday June 3rd

Begins with fresh gales from the N. Y. E. with passing squalls ship heading N. N. E. at sunset shortened sail and tacked ship latter part Clear ship heading S. W. wind N. E. one sail in sight
