

Remarks on the Charleston Ground

Friday June 4th

Begins with fresh gales from the South with passing rain squalls the ship heading E by S at sunset shortened sail for the night latter part moderate gales from the S.W. with light passing squalls ship heading S.E.

Saturday June 5th

Begins with passing rain squalls from the eastward with distant thunder the ship to the southward at sunset shortened sail for the night. Mill and latter part variable with heavy rain attended with thunder the ship under short sail

Sunday June 6th

Begins with passing squalls and variables the ship headed different courses as the rain hauled. Mill part the same latter part moderate gales from the South with clear weather ship heading E by E

Monday June 7th

Begins with moderate gales from the South with clear weather ship heading on different tracks at sunset shortened sail latter part variable with heavy rain with thunder one sail in sight

Tuesday June 8th

Begins with moderate gales from the N.E. with cloudy weather ship heading S.E. at sunset shortened sail one sail in sight latter part fresh gales from the N.E. with clear weather ship heading E by E at 9 a.m. spoke the Barque Pacific of New Bedford Allen Master fifteen days out Capt. Tripp went on board for letters at 10 a.m. braced forward

Wednesday June 9th

Begins with fresh gales from the E.N.E. with clear weather the ship heading S.E. at 7 P.M. spoke the Barque Pacific at sunset shortened sail for the night. Mill and latter part strong gales the ship under short sail

Thursday June 10th

Begins with strong gales from the N.E. with clear weather ship under short sail heading S.E. at sunset shortened sail for the night latter part moderate gales from the N.E. with clear pleasant weather ship heading N.N.W. one sail in sight

Lat 29.47 Long 75.28

Friday June 11th

Begins with moderate gales from the N.E. with clear pleasant weather ship heading N.N.W. at sunset shortened sail at 8 P.M. spoke the Barque Pacific and Gamed at 10 P.M. broke up the gam and braced forward. Mill and latter part light airs and calm three sail in sight the steward off duty sick

Lat 30.16 Long 75.27

Saturday June 12th

Begins with a calm three sail in sight latter part light airs from the South ship heading N one sail in sight

Lat 30.34 Long 75.10

Sunday June 13th

Begins with light airs from the South with clear weather steering N four sail in sight at sunset shortened sail latter part steering N.E. four sail in sight

Lat 31.23 Long 74.54
