

Remarks off St Marys

Saturday Sept 4th

Begins with fresh gales from the North with Clear weather the ship heading E N E at sunset shortened sail Middle part the same latter part fresh gales from the N E the ship heading S E at 9 a.m. saw the land the island of St Marys Bearing N E per Compass about thirty miles distant one sail in sight saw a Bruck

Lat 36 24 Long 25 10

Sunday Sept 5th

Begins with strong gales from the E N E with Clear weather the ship under short sail heading S E the island of St Marys Bearing N E one sail in sight at sunset shortened and wore ship the ship heading N Middle and latter part wind the same one sail in sight

Lat 36 39 Long 25 33

Monday Sept 6th

Begins with moderate gales from the East with Clear weather the ship under all sail heading N N E the islands of St. Marys and St. Michaels in sight at sunset shortened sail and wore ship the island of St. Marys Bearing East per Compass about twenty miles distant latter part light airs from the South the ship heading on different tacks of the island

Lat Long

Tuesday Sept 7th

Begins with light airs from the South with Clear pleasant weather the ship heading on different tacks the sail in sight at sunset shortened sail the island of St. Marys Bearing East ten miles distant latter part fresh gales from the West steering off S E at 7 a.m. passed a whaling Barge

Wednesday Sept 8th

Begins with fresh gales from the West with Clear weather the Course South at sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind heading S. S. W latter part light airs and variable steering South

Lat 35 16 Long 24 11

Thursday Sept 9th

Begins with light airs and variable the Course South at sunset shortened sail latter part fresh gales from the N. W with Clear weather the Course S at 10 a.m. hove down and picked up a ship's water tank

Lat 34 23 Long 24 22

Friday Sept 10th

Begins with moderate gales from the N. W with Clear weather steering South at sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind latter part steering S. E

Lat 33 58 Long 23 12

Saturday Sept 11th

Begins with moderate gales from the North with Clear weather with a heavy N. E. swell the Courses S E at sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind Middle and latter part wind and weather the same steering S S E

Lat 33 40 Long 22 16

Sunday Sept 12th

Begins with moderate gales from the North with passing clouds the Course S S E at 1.30 p.m. spoke the ship, Frick Perry of New Bedford Kilder Master at sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind latter part moderate gales from the E S E the ship under all sail heading South
