

Remarks at Teneriffe Western I. Tripp Master

Thursday Sept 23rd

Begins with Moderate gales from the E.N.E. with Cloudy weather the ship heading S.E. latter part heading S.E.

Friday Sept 24th

Begins with Moderate gales from the E.N.E. with Clear weather the ship under all sail heading off and on the island of Teneriffe Middle and latter part the same

Saturday Sept 25th

Begins with Moderate gales from the N.E. with Cloudy weather the ship heading E.S.E. at sunset run down off the Town of St. Cruz and shortened sail and then headed off on Middle and latter part strong gales from the North with Clear weather latter part heading in shore at 11 a.m. and at 11 a.m. anchored off the Town of St. Cruz the island of Teneriffe in twenty five fathoms of water hauled out forty five fathoms of ~~Cat~~ Cable and furled the sails

Sunday Sept 26th Harbor work

This day fresh gales from the East the starboard watch had liberty on shore

Monday Sept 27th

This day fine weather the starboard watch had liberty

Tuesday Sept 28th

This day fine weather took in water and rice potatoes

Wednesday Sept 29th

Friday fine weather at 8 a.m. got under way from San Lorenzo with the wind N.E. and stood out to sea the Capt. went in with the boat to look after two men that runaway at Ten Cuman Board did not find them

Thursday Sept 30th Sea account

Begins with Moderate gales from the N.E. with Clear weather the ship on cleaveant stacks heading in between the islands Grand Canary and Teneriffe at sunset shortened sail Middle and latter part the same

Friday Sept October 1st

Begins with Moderate gales from the N.E. with Clear weather the ship on cleaveant stacks between the islands of Grand Canary and Teneriffe at sunset shortened sail at 12.30 a.m. the Capt. went in to the Town of San Lorenzo to look for the two men that runaway ends with fresh gales from the N.E. with Squally weather

Saturday Oct 2nd

Begins with fresh gales from the N.E. with Squally weather the ship lying off and on at San Cruz at the island of Teneriffe at 1.30 P.M. the Capt. Cum on board did not find the runaway seamen kept the ship off South at sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind latter part heavy off S.W. the sail in sight Salt Long

Sunday Oct 3rd

Begins with Moderate gales from the N.E. with Clear pleasant weather the Course S.W. two sail in sight Middle and latter part the same Salt 23.47 Long 17.50

Monday Oct 4th

Begins with Moderate gales from the N.E. with Clear weather the Course S.W. By. W. one sail in sight Middle and latter part wind and weather the same Salt 24.24 Long 19.01
