Sunday oct 17th

Begins with fresh gales from the N E with smoky weather the ship under short sail heading S E at sunset shortened sail for the night latter part moderate

Monday oct 18th

Begins with moderate gales from the E N E with clear weather the ship heading S E at sunset shortened sail latter part fresh gales ship heading N E

Lat 17 42 Long 26 15

Tuesday oct 19th

Begins with fresh gales from the E N E with smoky weather the ship heading S E at sunset shortened sail latter part the same

Wednesday oct 20th

Begins with fresh gales from the E N E with smoky weather the ship heading S E at 1 P.M. saw the land the island of St. Vincent bearing E N E about thirty miles distant at sunset shortened sail latter part the same the islands of St. Antonio and St. Vincent in sight bearing to the Northward and Eastward at about thirty miles distance one sail in sight

Lat Long

Thursday oct 21st

Begins with clearing weather sometimes blowing strong in puffs off the high land the ship heading S E by the wind at sunset shortened sail latter part light airs still in sight

Friday oct 22nd

Begins with fresh gales from the E N E with clear weather the ship heading S E the islands of St. Antonio and St. Vincent still in sight middle and latter part wind and weather the same at 11 a.m. saw the islands of St. Jago and Jago

Saturday oct 23rd

Begins with fresh gales from the N E with clear weather the ship heading S E at 5 P.M. started off S. by E the island of St. Jago bearing E S E per Compass fifteen miles distant latter part by eye becalmed under the lee of St. Jago about five miles from land saw one sail

Sunday oct 24th

Begins with moderate gales from the N E with clear weather the course S E at 5 P.M. lost sight of the land latter part fresh gales one sail in sight

Monday oct 25th

Begins with fresh gales from the N E with clear weather the course S S E two sail in sight middle and latter part equally same Blackbirds

Tuesday oct 26th

Begins with fresh gales from the N E with passing squalls with distant thunder the course S E by S at sunset showed light sails and report the topsails latter part moderate with clear weather two sail in sight

Wednesday oct 27th

Begins with moderate gales from the East with clear weather the ship heading S S E middle and latter part the same

Lat 9.53 Long 20.09

Thursday oct 28th

Begins with moderate gales from the N E with clear weather the course S S E middle and latter part the same
