Begins with Moderate gales from the N.E. with Clear weather steering N.W. at sunset shortened sail latter part raining one sail in sight

Thursday Nov 11th

Begins with Moderate gales from the South with Clear weather the ship heading N.W. at sunset shortened sail latter part Calm

Lat 3.38 Long 19.3

Friday Nov 12th

Begins with a Calm at sunset took a light breeze from the South ship heading West at sunset shortened sail latter part wind and weather the same one sail in sight

Lat 3.35 Long 20.22

Saturday Nov 13th

Begins with light airs squalls and variable at sunset shortened sail Middle part Calm latter part light airs from the S.W. ship heading E.S.E. three sail in sight

Sunday Nov 14th

Begins with Moderate gales from the S.W. with Clear weather ship heading E.S.E. at 4 P.M. looked for Black fish the west Boat struck and cut the line off and lost the fish at sunset shortened sail latter part light squalls

Monday Nov 15th

Begins with Moderate gales from the South with squally weather the ship heading S.W. at 6 P.M. toward for Black fish without success at sunset shortened sail Middle and latter part squally

Begins with light airs squalls and variable the ship heading East N. East the wind mostly S.E. at sunset backed ship Middle part Clear latter part squally with heavy rain three sail in sight toward for Black fish got none Full Day

Wednesday Nov 17th

Begins with Moderate gales from the S.E. with rainy weather the ship heading S.E. two sail in sight at sunset shortened sail latter part Clear Chasing Black fish two sail in sight

Lat 4.12 Long 20.2

Thursday Nov 18th

Begins with Moderate gales from the South with Clear weather saw phinbacks one sail in sight latter part Calm

Lat 4.56 Long 20.01

Friday Nov 19th

Begins with light airs from the S.E. the Boats down Black fishing got none at sunset shortened sail the Course N.E. at 7 P.M. took a thunder squall from the eastward Middle and latter part squally with heavy rain saw one sail Full Day

Saturday Nov 20th

Begins with thunder squalls from the S.E. the Course N.E. at 2 P.M. blew away the old fore top sail in a squall at 4 P.M. bent a new one at sunset shortened sail Middle and latter part the same
