shortened sail Middle and latter part the same
the wack employed fitting the fore rigging

Wednesday Dec 15th

Begins with moderate gales from the N.E. with
Clear pleasant weather the ship heading N.W. at
sunset shortened sail and tacked ship Middle and
latter part wind and weather the same ship heading
on different tacks one sail in sight
Lat 6.48 Long 18.59

Thursday Dec 16th

Begins with moderate gales from the East with
Clear weather the ship heading on different tacks
at 1 P.M. spoke the schooner Carrie M. Clark
Dyer Master the wack employed fitting the fore
rigging at sunset shortened sail latter part fresh
gales one sail in sight
Lat 6.25 Long 18.16

Friday Dec 17th

Begins with fresh gales from the E.N.E. with
smoky weather the ship on different tacks at sunset
shortened sail one sail in sight latter part heading N
Lat 6.34 Long 18.20

Saturday Dec 18th

Begins with light airs from the E. & E. with smoky
weather the ship heading N.E. at sunset shortened sail
latter part steering S.W.
Lat 6.48 Long 18.22

Sunday Dec 19th

Begins with light airs from the N.E. with smoky
weather steering S.W. at sunset shortened sail
latter part steering N.W.
Lat 6.42 Long 18.34

Begins with light airs from the N.E. with clear
weather the Course N.W. at sunset shortened sail
Middle and latter part the same one sail in sight
Lat 6.56 Long 19.10

Tuesday Dec 21st

Begins with light airs from the N.E. with smoky
weather the Course N.W. By W. latter part moderate
gales the wack employed fitting the main rigging
Lat 6.54 Long 19.15

Wednesday Dec 22nd

Begins with moderate gales from the N.E. with
Clear weather the Course W. N.W. latter part steering W.
Lat 6.54 Long 21.15

Thursday Dec 23rd

Begins with moderate gales from the N.E. with smoky
weather the Course W. at sunset shortened sail Middle
and latter part verily with thunder squalls
Lat 6.54 Long 21.15

Friday Dec 24th

Begins with light airs Calm and variable with
thunder squalls the ship heading different Courses at sunset
shortened sail latter part heavy squalls
from the East the Course west one sail in sight
saw algeriens
Lat 6.54 Long 21.15

Saturday Dec 25th

Begins with strong gales from the S.E. with
Cloudy weather the ship under short sail heading
on different tacks one sail in sight at 4 a.m.
spoke the ship Garaborda latter part steering
S.W.
