Saturday Jan 8th

Begins with moderate gales from the N.E. with
Clear weather the ship heading on divergent tracks
at sunset shortened sail one sail in sight latter
part strong gales from the N.E. with passing rain
squalls ship under short sail heading N.N.W.

Sunday Jan 9th

Begins with fresh gales from the N.E. with
Cloudy weather the ship under short sail heading
N.N.W. latter part Clear

Lat 43.37 Long 23.44

Monday Jan 10th

Begins with strong gales from the N.N.E. with
Clear weather ship under short sail heading N.W.
at sunset wore ship latter part strong S.W.

Tuesday Jan 11th

Begins with strong gales from the N.N.E. with
passing squalls turning South at sunset light
by the wind N.W. middle and latter part variable with
heavy rain squalls one sail in sight

Wednesday Jan 12th

Begins with moderate gales from the East with
Cloudy weather ship heading N.N.E. at sunset wore
ship latter part Clear ship heading N. one sail in sight

Lat 43.17 Long 24.12

Thursday Jan 13th

Begins with moderate gales from the E.N.E. with
Clear weather ship heading N. at sunset shortened sail
latter part fresh gales at 9 a.m. spoke the
schooner E. B. Cornwall of Provincetown forty
days from home Cap. Tripp on Board for
papers at 10 made forward and hoisted Boat

Friday Jan 14th

Begins with fresh gales from the N.E. with
Clear weather showing S.W. at 4.30 P.M.
spoke the Brig Rosa Baker of Boston Gifford
Master three months out with 60 barrels at
sunset the schooner E. B. Cornwall seen down
and all three vessels had a gam at 4 P.M.
hoisted the Boat latter part moderate gales from
the N.E. with Clear weather ship heading N.N.W. two
sail in sight

Lat 43.09 Long 25.09

Saturday Jan 15th

Begins with moderate gales from the N.E. with
Clear pleasant weather ship under all sail heading
N.N.W. two sail in sight at 4 P.M. saw Schooner
maneuvering and at 5 P.M. saw her fore sail down
supposed that she had a whale at sunset shortened
sail latter part heading on divergent tracks saw
the schooner in cutting

Lat 43.08 Long 25.37

Sunday Jan 16th

Begins with light airs and Calm one sail in sight
at sunset shortened sail latter part moderate gales
ship heading to the S.E. at 6.30 a.m. spoke the
schooner E. B. Cornwall former his Boiling a
thirty barrel sperm whale at 8 a.m. passed a
merchant ship heading South

Lat 43.58 Long 25.16

Monday Jan 17th

Begins with moderate gales from the N.E. with
Clear weather ship heading S.E. two sail in sight
at sunset shortened sail latter part heading
N.W. at 6.30 a.m. saw sperm whale going South
at 7.30 a.m. hoisted all three sails and at 8 the Boat
hook struck the harbour Boat went up to two whales
and missed them Chased till 11 a.m. and got them
up

12 lbs WB
