Thursday Jan 20th

Begins with fresh gals from the N.E. with clear weather
the ship heading on different tacks at 7 A.M. saw
and heard all three boats for sperm whales going
quick to the N.W. the west boat started and
did not fasten the ~~boat~~ ^{last boat} boats that return must
a large whale and he was broke ends with fine
weather the boats chasing a whale saw several said
Lat 5.30

Friday Jan 21st

L B 30 lbs

Begins with moderate gals from the N.E. with
clear weather the boats chasing whales at 12.30 P.M.
Came out on board at 2 P.M. forward again for
galley whale took Capt. J. Lake to ship the last boat
at 4 P.M. the last boat about 100 lbs
fifty barrel whale at 4.30 turned him up
and came bearing for the ship at 8 P.M. took him
along side and shortened sail at daylight came
cutting at 10 A.M. finished two sail in sight

Sunday Jan 23rd

Begins with fresh gals from the N.N.E. with
clear weather the ship heading East the watch
employed boiling the whale at 5 A.M. finished
boiling out ends with moderate gals one sail in sight

Lat 5.20 Long 25.05

Monday Jan 24th

Begins with moderate gals from the N.N.E. with
clear weather the ship heading on different tacks
latter part stood down 31 Barrels of oil

Tuesday Jan 25th

Begins with fresh gals from the N.E. with clear
weather the ship heading N.N.W. middle and latter
part the same same one sail

Lat 5.45 Long 26.27

Wednesday Jan 26th

Begins with fresh gals from the East N.E. with
clear weather ship heading North at 3 P.M. passed
a Portuguese Brig named the Maria at 6 P.M.
tacked ship middle and latter part variable with
heavy rain the ship heading on different tacks under
short sail one sail in sight
