

Remarks at Barbados

Wednesday Feb 23

Begins with moderate gales from the East with clear sky and weather the Course West latter part the same

Lat 13.23 Long 59.04

Thursday Feb 24

Begins with moderate gales from the East with clear weather the Course W. S. W. the sail in sight at sunset and a wind latter part fresh gales at daylight saw the land the island of Barbados bearing west about 25 miles distant and at 10 a.m. came to Anchor in five fathoms of water off Bridge town Barbados furled the sails and washed the ship out side

Friday Feb 25

This day fine weather the starboard watch had liberty ashore the Port watch employed painting the ship's outside Clarence W. Med. Edward Boden James Willis Charles Miller all this day run away from the ship

Saturday Feb 26

This day fine weather the Larboard watch had liberty on shore and this day the Capt. Discharged Tubinies, Wilcox for a boatstern for missing three whals

Sunday Feb 27

This day fine weather the boatsterns on shore a few hours

Monday Feb 28

This day shipd five new men and man to live ~~on~~ aft in the Cabin making six in all there not known by me they being most all portugies

Wednesday 4 Driff, Mar. 65

Tuesday March the first sea account at 3 P.M. got under way from Barbados with six new men and one new hand a Black man being very drunk and abusive had to put him in irons his name was William Sumner Middle and latter part steering N. by W. for the island of Dominica with fresh gales

Lat Long

Wednesday March 2

Begins with fresh gales from the N.E. with clear weather at midnight saw the island of Dominica and at 10 a.m. dropped Anchor in Princess Bay in five fathoms of water and got off forty five Barrels of water

Thursday March 3

Begins with fine weather all hands employed getting off wood and salt water in the night the Schooners Delaghamas of Princess town came in and dropped Anchor twenty days from the States

Friday March 4

This day fine weather the crew employed getting off wood

Saturday March 5 Sea account

at 1 P.M. got under way from Princess Bay Dominica with the wind N.E. with pleasant weather and clear N.W. at sunset came up with the island of Guadalupe Middle part light winds under the island latter part fresh gales ship heading N.W. Lat 16.24 Long 62.51

Sunday March 6

Begins with fresh gales from the N.E. with clear weather the ship heading N.W. by the wind at sunset saw the land of Nevis and St. Kitts bearing from N.W. to N.N.E. at 6.30 dropped Anchor in the harbor of St. Eustatius in 8 fathoms of water furled the sails and let part of the crew go ashore for a run latter part squally
