

Remarks at St. Eustacia

Monday March 7th

at St. Eustacia the crew employed getting off yams and potatoes

Tuesday March 8th Sea account

Begins with fresh gales from the E N E with passing squalls at 6 P.M. got all hands on Board with Cabin Boy ships bar and rode to anchor and stered west but half reaches latter part more moderate past passed the island St. Cruis about 10 miles distant

Wednesday March 9th

Begins with moderate gales from the East with clear pleasant weather the course with some several sail at 2 P.M. passed to the west of the island of St. Cruis at sunset shortened sail and set Boats Crew reaches at daylight saw the island of Porto Rico the rest end bearing N about twenty miles distant latter part steering west along with the land some several sail

Lat Long

Thursday March 10th

Begins with moderate gales from the N E with clear weather steering W. by N at 2 P.M. passed the island of dead mans Chest at sunset shortened sail and luffed of E. by the wind Porto Rico is to astern about 10 miles off middle and latter part light airs and calm the ship heading to the westward along with the land four sail in sight

Lat Long

Friday March 11th

Begins with light airs from the S E with clear weather the ship heading to the S. W. the land bearing west about 10 miles distant at sunset shortened latter part light airs and calm the ship still off the S. W. end of the island of Porto Rico about fifteen miles distant

Saturday March 12th

Begins with moderate gales from the N N E with clear weather the ship heading W. by N at sunset shortened sail saw several sails E. Middle part blowing strong at 1 A.M. passed the island of Mona and at 10 A.M. passed the island of Sana the rest Boat went in to look for Mahogany could not find any at 10.30 the Boat came on Board

Lat Long

Sunday March 13th

Begins with fresh gales from the East with clear weather the course W. by N at sunset stowed light sails saw the island of St. Domingo bearing N N W about 40 miles distance Middle and latter part moderate

Lat Long

Monday March 14th

Begins with moderate gales from the E S E with clear pleasant weather the course W. by N at sunset saw the land of Cape Beata bearing W N W about 40 miles distant at 3 P.M. dropped anchor at the island of Boobain eight fathoms of water and payed out 44 fathoms of cable furled the sails and commenced painting the ship in side one Boat went on shore and killed a hog

Tuesday March 15th

Begins with fine weather all hands aft employed painting ship at 10 A.M. the Capt and second mate went on shore looking for wood

Wednesday March 16th

this day fine weather still lying at the island Beata waiting for the paint to dry
