

Remarks from San Bay to the Bahama
Saturday March 26th

Begins with fresh gales from the Eastward & tides
to the westward along the land the island of
St Domingo about 10 miles from land at sunset
shortened sail latter part Calm the ship about
10 miles from land. Lat Long

Sunday March 27th
Begins with a Calm the ship about 10 miles from
St Domingo the S.W. part at sunset shortened sail
middle part light airs latter part Calm
Lat 18.40 Long 74.31

Monday March 28th
Begins with light airs from the west the Course East
saw several sail at sunset the island of St Domingo
bearing S.E. about 20 miles distance at sunset
shortened sail latter part heading on different tack
Lat Long

Tuesday March 29th
Begins with light airs and variable the ship on different
tacks about 20 miles from St Domingo saw few sail
at sunset shortened sail latter part heading on different
from the N.W. with clear weather the ship heading
N.W. the sail in sight Lat Long

Wednesday 30th
Begins with fresh gales from the N.W. with clear
pleasant weather the ship heading N.W. at sunset
shortened sail St Domingo still in sight
bearing South 40 miles distant latter part
moderate saw the land a long way off
Lat Long

Thursday March 31st
Begins with a Calm at 5 P.M. took a light
breeze from the East the Course N.W.
latter part saw the land the island of Cuba
bearing from N.E. to N.W. about 30 miles
Distance Lat Long

Friday April 1st
Begins with light airs from the South with clear
weather the Course N. by E saw the sail at
sunset shortened sail the island of Cuba 40 miles
Distance latter part light airs variable the ship
about 15 miles from the N.E. end of Cuba
at 9 A.M. saw and lowered for a lone black
fish the Larboard Boat got him
Lat Long



Saturday April 2nd
Begins with light airs and variable the ship on
different tacks about 15 miles from Cuba at sunset
saw a rain squall shortened sail for the
night latter part light airs and Calm one sail in sight
Lat Long

Sunday April 3rd
Begins with fresh gales from the N.E. with passing
squalls the Course W. by S running down the south
side of Cuba about 12 miles from land at sunset
shortened sail latter part light airs one sail in sight
Lat Long

Monday April 4th
Begins with light airs from the S.E. with clear
weather the Course west running down the south side of
Cuba about 15 miles from land at sunset shortened
sail latter part light airs from the west
the ship on different tacks one sail in sight
Lat Long
