

Remarks from the Sam Bay to the Bahama
Sunday April 5th

Begins with light airs and variable the ship on
disport tacks the Land about 20 miles off.
Latter part light airs from the East steering
W. by S. now sail in sight Lat Long

Wednesday April 6th

Begins with moderate gales from the East with Clear
weather the Course W. by S. steering down the south
side of Cuba about 10 miles from Land two
sail in sight latter part heading South towards in sight
Lat Long

Thursday April 7th

Begins with moderate gales from the E. by S. with
Clear weather the ship heading south the island of
Cuba still in sight bearing N. along ways off
at sunset shortened sail at Daylight saw the
island of Jamaica bearing S. E. about 40 miles
off ends with a Calm Lat Long

Friday April 8th

Begins with light airs from the East with Clear
pleasant weather steering at 1 P. M. saw a whales
Carkees at sunset shortened sail the island bearing
S. E. the Center about 20 miles off latter part
Calm the west end of Jamaica bearing East
& miles off saw the Schooner Vernon an American
Lat Long

Saturday April 9th

Begins with a Calm at 4 P. M. Leeward for
Black fish get now two sail in sight
middle and latter part steering off W. N. W.

Sunday April 10th

Begins with fresh gales from the S. E. with
Clear weather the Course West at 9 a. M. saw
the Land the island of Grand Cayman
one sail in sight ends with fresh gales from
the South the ship heading in S. W. for the island

Monday April 11th

Begins with fresh gales from the South with
Clear weather the ship heading in for the island
at 1 P. M. a boat came off from the island with
a few vegetables give the same old Beef for them
and they went on shore again and we tacked
ship and headed E. by N. off shore at sunset
stood light sail latter part heading in and off
shore the Land bearing N. W. 12 miles distance

Tuesday April 12th

Begins with light breeze from the S. W. with
Clear weather the ship heading on shore and at
2 P. M. three Boats came from the shore and
brought Yams to trade for Amette at 6 P. M.
got three trading tacked ship and stood off
shore middle part heading west latter part
fresh gales from the North with Clear weather
ship heading W. by N. at 11 a. M. lost sight
of the island of Grand Cayman

Begins with fresh gales from the North with
Clear weather the ship heading W. by N.
at sunset stood light sail latter part fresh
gales from the East steering N. W. by N.
