

Remarks from San Bay to the Bahamas
Thursday April 14th
Begins with moderate gales from the East with
Clear weather the Course N.W. by N. latter part
strong gales ruffled the topsails

Friday April 15th
Begins with fresh gales from the E.N.E. with
Clear weather the Course N.W. at 3 P.M. saw
the Land the South Coast of Cuba run in to
about fifteen miles of the Land and the Murex
rest along the Land at 10 P.M. passed the light
on Cape En l'ion and at 10 P.M. hauled up N
latter part blowing strong from the E. & E
the ship under reefed topsails heading N.E. saw
several sail

Saturday April 16th
Begins with fresh gales from the S.E. with
Clear weather the ship heading E.N.E. under
reef topsails saw several sail latter part light
air saw a steamer

Lat 23.02 Long 84.55

Sunday April 17th
Begins with light air from the westward with
Clear weather the Course E.N.E. saw several sail
of vessels the sun sea rakes or half wakers
latter part blowing strong with rain squalls
ruffled the topsails ends with the wind N.N.E.
saw the Land the west coast of Cuba bearing
S.E. about 25 miles distance saw 6 sail

Monday April 18th

Begins with strong gales from the North with Clear
weather the ship under reefed topsails heading on
different tacks the island of Cuba still in
sight bearing S.E. four sail in sight latter part
moderate gales the ship under all sail the Land about
15 miles off two sail in sight

Tuesday April 19th

Begins with moderate gales from the North with
Clear weather the ship under all sail heading on
different tacks the N.W. side of Cuba about 20
miles off two sail in sight middle part the wind
hauled E.N.E. ship heading N. latter part tacks
and headed S.E. saw the Land and several sail

Lat 23.20 Long 82.30

Wednesday April 20th

Begins with fresh gales from the E.N.E. with
Clear weather the ship heading N. under all sail
saw several sail latter part moderate gales from
the South the Course E.N.E. saw the sand key
light house three sail in sight

Lat 24.19 Long 81.12

Thursday April 21th

Begins with light air and variable the Course
E.N.E. two sail in sight middle part the same
latter part moderate gales from the N.W. the ship
heading N.N.E. saw a light on the Florida side
saw two steamers and four sail Lat 25.34 Long 79.40

Friday April 22th

Begins with light air from the North with Clear weather
the ship heading E.N.E. saw the Land bearing E. & E.
at 5 P.M. tacked and headed west two sail
in sight middle part Calm latter part moderate
gales from the North ship heading W.N.W. three
sail in sight
