fish without success two sail in sight

Begins with light breezes from the South
with Clear weather the ship heading E.S.E.
at 6 P.M. lowered a Boat and caught
a turtle at sunset stowed eight sails
latter part light airs from the S.W.
at 9 A.M. lowered the last Boat for
Blackfish without success

Begins with light airs variable and Calms
the ship heading on different tacks at sunset
shortened sail Middle and latter part fresh
gales from the East with Clear weather the ship

Begins with fresh gales from the East with
Clear weather the ship heading South at sunset
shortened sail and wore ship Middle part heading
N.E. latter part heading South

Friday April 29th

Begins with fresh gales from the E.S.E. with
Clear weather the ship under all Cruising sail
heading South at sunset shortened sail and tacked
Ship latter part light rain squalls from the
S.E. the ship heading S.W.

Saturday April 30th

Begins with fresh gales from the S.E. with
Clear weather the ship heading S.W. saw one
sail at sunset shortened sail and wore ship
Middle and latter part heading on different tacks

Lat 28.40 Long 78.20

Sunday May 1st

Begins with fresh gales from the South with Clear
weather the ship heading W.S.W. saw three sail
at sunset took a thunder squall from the N.W.
shortened sail Middle part rainy weather latter
part fresh gales from the S.W. the ship heading
West two sail in sight
