

Remarks Cruising in the Bahamas

Thursday May 12th

Begins with fresh gales from the West the ship heading S.E. at sunset shortened sail Middle and latter part light airs and Calm.

Friday May 13th

Begins with light airs from the W.N.W. with clear weather the ship heading S.S.W. at sunset shortened sail latter part fresh gales from the N.W. steering S.S.E. saw three sail

Lat 27.52 Long 78.37

Saturday May 14th

Begins with moderate gales from the N.W. steering S.S.E. at sunset shortened and luffed by the wind N.E. Middle and latter part variable winds at 7 a.m. saw the Bahama Keys Bearing S.E. the ship heading South at 9 a.m. saw the Bahama reef Bearing S.W. at 10 a.m. wore ship and steered N.W. at 11 a.m. took a Minder squall from the E.N.E. shortened sail as required and luffed by the wind N.

Sunday May 15th

Begins with strong gales from the N.E. with quick passing clouds the ship heading N.W. at sunset shortened sail and took up the mast Boat Middle part moderate latter part variable with Minder squalls the ship heading different Courses shortened sail as required

Begins with variables and Minder squalls the ship heading different Courses at sunset shortened sail Middle and latter part fresh gales from the N.N.E. with clear weather the ship heading East

Begins with moderate gales from the W.N.W. with clear weather the ship heading N. at sunset shortened sail latter part fresh gales from the N.E. with clear weather the ship heading N.N.W.

Thursday May 19th

Begins with fresh gales from the N.E. with clear weather the ship heading N.N.W. at sunset shortened sail Middle and latter part wind and weather the same saw one sail

Lat 30.11 Long 78.15

Friday May 20th

Begins with fresh gales from the N.E. with clear weather the ship heading N.N.W. at sunset shortened sail latter part heading S.S.E.

Lat 30.02 Long 78.34

Saturday May 21st

Begins with fresh gales from the East with clear weather the ship heading S.S.E. at sunset shortened sail and took up ship latter part moderate gales saw one sail the ship heading N.N.E.
