

Remarks Cruising on the Bahamas

Sunday May 22

Begins with Moderate gales from the East with Clear weather the ship heading N. N. E. at sunset short tined sail Middle and latter part the same Lat 30.12 Long 78.25

Monday May 23

Begins with Moderate gales from the East with Clear weather the ship heading N. N. E. at sunset short tined sail Middle and latter part the same all this twenty four hours found a strong southerly Current Lat 30.08 Long 78.36

Tuesday May 24

Begins with Moderate gales from the East with Clear weather the ship heading N. N. E. at sunset stood light sails latter part wind S. E ship heading N. E. one sail in sight Lat 31.08 Long 78.04

Wednesday May 25

Begins with Moderate gales from the S. E. with Clear weather the ship heading E. N. E. one sail in sight at sunset short tined sail latter part fresh gales from the E. S. E. the ship heading N. E. one sail in sight Lat 31.30 Long 77.10

Thursday May 26

Begins with fresh gales from the East with Clear weather the ship heading N. N. E. saw one sail at sunset short tined sail and backed ship Middle and latter part Blowing strong with thunder squalls the ship under short sail the wind veering from S. E. to west saw two sail

Friday May 27

Begins with fresh gales from the S. W. with passing squalls the Course S. E. Middle and latter part Blowing strong the Course E. S. E. Lat 31.25 Long 76.05

Saturday May 28

Begins with strong gales from the S. W. with passing squalls the ship under reef topsails steering E. S. E. at 2 P. M. furled the fore top sail and hove to under single reef main top sail and fore Course the ship heading S. S. E. saw one sail Middle and latter part more Moderate Made sail as required steering N. E. wind S. W. Lat 30.48 Long 75.15

Sunday May 29

Begins with fresh gales from the S. W. with smoky weather the ship heading N. W. at 3 P. M. took a thunder squall from the N. W. short tined sail Middle part heavy thunder squalls the wind veering all round the Compass latter part strong gales from the S. E. with Clear weather the ship heading S. W. under reef topsails saw two sail Lat 31.14 Long 76.27

Monday May 30

Begins with strong gales from the S. S. E. with Clear weather the ship under reef top sails heading S. W. at 3 P. M. took a thunder squall from the westward Middle part and latter part light airs and calm saw three sail the back rympled repairing old sails
