Tuesday May 31st

Begins with light airs from the E & ENE
Clear weather the ship heading N.E saw five
sail at sunset shortened sail for the night middle
and latter part light airs and variables saw
five sail Lat 31.16 Long 76.35

Wednesday June 1st

Begins with moderate gales from the E & E
with Clear weather the ship heading N.E saw
three sail at sunset shortened sail latter part
wind and weather the same at 5 A.M. leeward
for Black fish got one

Thursday June 2nd

Begins with moderate gales from the E & E
with Clear weather the ship heading E.N.E
three sail in sight at sunset shortened sail
latter part fresh gales from the South with
passing squalls boiled out the Black fish
the ship on different tack saw two sail

Friday June 3rd

Begins with fresh gales from the South with
Squally weather the ship on different tack
at sunset shortened sail latter part the same
saw three sail Lat Long

Saturday June 4th

Begins with strong gales from the South with thick weather
at 1 P.M. took a thunder squall from the N.W. at 2 P.M.
Chased off at 4 P.M. passed and hailed a schooner
from wellfleet, Vermont North at 6 P.M. spoke
the schooner Ellen Redman of Port Haven & went
out with 25 sperm Jennings Master gained till
9 P.M. saw 5 ~~that~~ sail latter part light
airs and Calms with passing thunder squalls two sail
in sight Lat 31.40 Long 76.16

Begins with a calm two sail in sight latter
part light airs from the South the ship heading
Eastward saw 7 sail Lat 30.58 Long 75.41

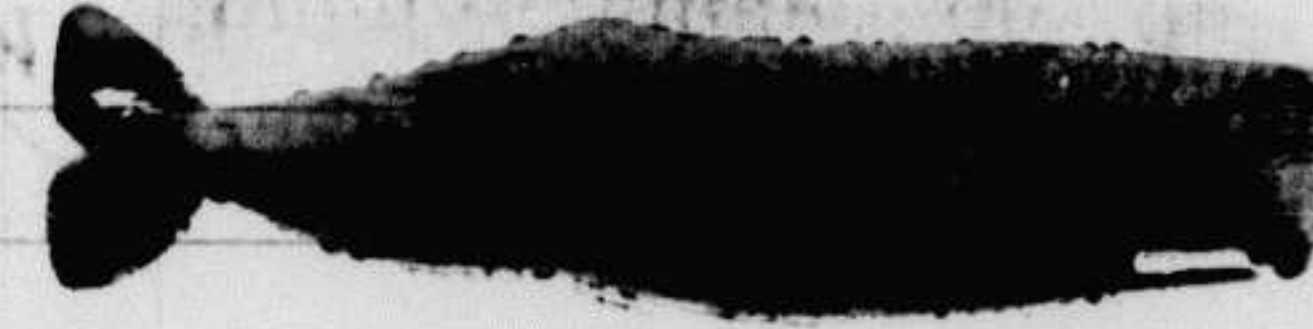
Monday June 6th

Begins with light airs from the South the ship
heading on different tack 6 sail in sight at
sunset shortened sail latter part moderate
gales from the E & E the ship heading South 4 sail
in sight Lat 30.48 Long 75.30

Tuesday June 7th

Begins with moderate gales from the E & E
with Clear pleasant weather the ship heading
South four sail in sight at sunset shortened sail
latter part light airs from the N.E. at 5.30 A.M.
saw a school of sperm whales going N.N.W.
at 6.30 A.M. leeward two Harbours Boat the
Starboard Boat took the ships Chance then both
came to the ship and the Starboard Boat
got a small whale at 11.30 A.M. took the whale
to the ship the officers Ellen Redman aboard
his Boats but none Lat 30.25 Long 74.42
