

Remarks Cruising on the Charleston Ground

Thursday June 16th

Begins with Moderate gales from the S & E with
Clear pleasant weather the ship heading S.W. several
sail in sight at sunset short tined sail Middle and
latter part the ship heading on different tacks

saw 7 sail Lat 30.25 Long 74.10

Friday June 17th

Begins with Moderate gales from the south with
Clear weather the ship heading on different tacks
saw several vessels at sunset short tined sail
Middle and latter part wind and weather the same
saw several sail Lat 30.12 Long 74.42

Saturday June 18th

Begins with Moderate gales from the S & E^W
with Clear weather the ship heading on different
tacks saw 4 sail at 3 P.M. spoke the Schooner
Estelle of Provencetown Higgins Master twenty
lengths out with 80 Barrels of gunpowder until 9
P.M. Middle and latter part wind and weather
the same saw 5 sail

Sunday June 19th

Begins with Moderate gales from the S.W.
with Clear pleasant weather the ship on different
tacks 5 sail in sight at sunset sunset short tined
sail Middle and latter part wind and weather
the same saw 5 whaling schooners

Monday June 20th

Begins with light airs from the S.W. with
Clear weather the ship on different tacks at sun
set short tined sail saw 5 sail latter part
fresh gales saw three sail

Tuesday June 21st

Begins with fresh gales from the S & W with
light passing squalls the ship on different
tacks saw the sail at sunset short tined sail
Middle part squally with thunder latter part
passing squalls one sail in sight Lat 29.50 Long 74.24

Wednesday June 22nd

Begins with fresh gales from the W & W with
Clear weather the ship on different tacks at
sunset short tined sail one whaler in sight latter
part Moderate saw 4 sail

Thursday June 23

Begins with a calm three sail in sight latter part
variable with light squalls

Lat 30.02 Long 75.08

Friday June 24th

Begins with Moderate gales from the East
with Clear weather the Course N.W. 4 sail
in sight at sunset short tined sail and lapped
N.N.E. By the wind latter part stored off N.W.
again saw three sail

Saturday June 25th

Begins with Moderate gales from the E.N.E.
with Clear weather during N.W. saw three
sail at sunset short tined sail and lapped by
the wind Middle and latter part Calm
two sail in sight sent down the main
Course for repairs
