Sunday June 26th

Begins with a Calm one sail in sight then
fair light airs from the west the ship heading
S. by W. at 7.30 a.m. spoke the Schooner
Life Boat of Newbury port

with Clear weather the ship on different
tacks at sunset short tuck sail three sail in

with Clear weather the ship on different tacks
at sunset short tuck sail latter part strong
gales from the S.W. with three sail

Begins with moderate gales from the West
with Clear weather the ship in sight the ship
heading west at sunset short tuck sail three
part Calm latter part moderate gales
from the S.W. the ship heading W. by N.
saw several sail

Begins with moderate gales from the S.W.
with Clear weather the ship heading S. by E
saw several sail at sunset short tuck sail
latter part strong gales the ship on different
tacks saw two sail

Begins with fresh gales from the S.W.
with Clear weather the ship heading S. by E
at 4 P.M. spoke and gained with the Brig
Grace Lathrop of Provinstown South Master
25 Months out 400 Barrels of oil latter
part fresh gales with three sail
steering S. E saw two sail

Saturday July 2nd

Begins with fresh gales from the S.W.
with passing squalls steering N. E three
sail in sight at sunset short tuck sail and
latter part the wind S. E latter part Clear
saw three sail

Sunday July 3rd

Begins with fresh gales from the S.W. with
Clear weather the ship heading S. E three sail
at 5.30 P.M. spoke the Schooner D. by D. Dyer
of Provinstown Tropic Master 15 Months out
with 300 Barrels of oil Gained till 9 P.M.
at sunset short tuck sail three and latter part
the ship on different tacks saw two sail

Lat 30.40 Long 76.21

Monday July 4th

Begins with fresh gales from the South with
Clear weather the ship on different tacks at
sunset short tuck sail three and latter part
squally

Lat 30.22 Long 76.40

Tuesday July 5th

Begins with fresh gales from the S.W. with squally
weather the ship on different tacks at sunset short tuck sail
latter part wind S. E ship heading E. by E
