Wednesday July 6th

Begins with moderate gales from the S. E. with
Clear weather the ship heading E. N. E. at sunset
stood light sails middle and latter part wind
and weather the same at 9 a. m. saw a school
of sperm whales going quick to the North at
10 a. m. forward all three Boats and at 11 a. m.
the Starboard Boat took the whale to the ship
shook and at 12 m. took

the whale to the ship the other two Boats
will Chasing L.B.

Thursday July 7th

Begins with fresh gales from the South with
passing squalls at 2 P. m. the Boats in with the
whales and Cumen Board and Cumen Cutting at
4 P. m. finished Cutting and cut the whale up
one sail in sight latter part the sack employed

Friday July 8th

Begins with fresh gales from the South with
passing squalls the ship heading E. by S the
sack employed Boiling the whale at sunset
stood light sail saw one sail at 2 a. m. finished
Boiling latter part strong gale Lat 31.58 Long 66.09

Saturday July 9th

Begins with strong gales from the South with passing Clouds
the Course East ship under full sail at 4 P. m. finished
jib and spars at 8 P. m. saw the lights on Bermuda
Bearing East tackel ship and headed off shore latter
part heading in shore at 9 a. m. saw the land the
islands of Bermuda Bearing E. S. E. at 10 packed
off shore the distance 20 miles Lat 32.28 Long 65.53

Sunday July 10th

Begins with moderate gales from the South
with Clear weather the ship in deep and tack
heading in and off shore at sunset stood light sail
latter part stood in shore the land Bearing E. S. E.
about 20 miles distance Lat 32 Long

Monday July 11th

Begins with light airs from the S. W. with Clear
weather the ship heading S. S. E. at sunset Calm
the Light house Bearing East 12 miles distant
stood light sail for the night middle part Calm latter
part light airs from the S. W. the ship heading
S. by E the land Bearing S. E. 10 miles distant
the sail in sight stood down 18 Barrels of sperm
oil at 12 P. m. a pilot Boat Cume off from
the shore stopped a few minutes and left again
saw a land ship ashore on the reef

Tuesday July 12th

Begins with light airs from the W. S. W. with Clear
weather the ship heading South to the westward
of the island at sunset stood light sail the light
house Bearing N. E. 10 miles distance latter part
lying off and on off the Light house at Bermuda
at 6 a. m. the Capt went ashore in the Starboard
Boat for recruits and letters the ship lying
off and on at the south of the Light house

Wednesday July 13th

Begins with moderate gales from the West with Clear
weather the ship still lying off and on at Bermuda the
Capt ashore at 6.30 P. m. the Capt Cumen Board and
stood E. by S latter part equally both times
steering E
