weather the same two sail in sight

Begins with moderate gales from the S.W. with
Clear weather the Course East one sail in
sight Middle and latter part fresh gales
with Cloudy weather

Sunday July 17th
Begins with strong gales from the N.W. with
to the north with passing thunder squalls the
Course East the ship under short sail saw a
Whale steering N.E. latter part squally

Monday July 18th
Begins with fresh gales from the west with Clear
weather the Course East one sail in sight Middle
and latter part the same Lat 33.33 Long 54.31

Tuesday July 19th
Begins with fresh gales from the N.W. with
Clear weather the Course East at sunset shortened
sail and luffed south by the wind at daylight
hepp off East and made sail

Begins with fresh gales from the N.W. with
Clear weather the Course East at sunset shortened

passing squalls steering E.S.E. at sunset shortened
sail and luffed by the wind latter part heavy
rain with thunder Lat 31 Long

Friday July 22nd
Begins with fresh gales from the S.W. with Cloudy
weather the ship heading S.E. at sunset shortened
sail Middle and latter part passing squalls

Saturday July 23rd
Begins with fresh gales from the N.W. with
passing squalls the ship heading South
at sunset shortened sail latter part Clear

Sunday July 24th
Begins with fresh gales from the N.W. with

sunset shortened sail latter part heading N.E.
