Begins with light airs from the N.W. with hazy weather the ship under all sail heading N.W. at 5 P.M. lowered the Boats for Blackfish got none at sunset the boat sail latter part Clear strong East

Begins with light airs from the west with Clear weather strong East at sunset shorted sail latter part fresh gales the ship under all sail heading N.W. at 11 P.M. N.N.W.

Sunday Aug 28th

Begins with fresh gales from the west with Clear weather the ship heading N.N.W. at sunset shorted sail Middle part the same latter part blowing strong from the N.W. with heavy rain the wind backing round to North and East the ship under fore course and reefed main top sail heading to the N.W.

Monday Aug 29th

Begins with strong gales from the N.E. with passing squalls the ship under short sail heading N.W. at sunset shorted sail and Bared down the backed down one sail latter part Clear the ship heading N.N.W.

Begins with strong gales from the E.N.E. with Clear weather the ship under short sail heading North latter part moderate

Begins with light airs from the N.E. with Clear weather the ship heading N.N.W. Bent a new fore top masts staysail and spanker at sunset shorted sail Middle and latter part Calm

Begins with a Calm Middle and latter part the same

Friday September 2nd

Begins with Clear weather and Calm Middle and latter part the same

Lat 39.10 Long

Saturday Sept 3rd

Begins with light airs from the N.E. with Clear weather the ship heading E.S.E. at sunset shorted sail latter part moderate gales from the East the ship heading N.N.E.

Lat 40.07 Long 49.30

Sunday Sept 4th

Begins with moderate gales from the East with Clear weather the ship heading N.N.E. saw one sail at sunset shorted sail latter part fresh gales a sail in sight at 9 A.M. saw a school of sperm whales going quick to the windward galied by a merchant brig lowered two Boats first and gave chase at 10 A.M. the third made leeward
