

Remarks on board Sunday July the 11th

Coment with fresh breezes from the northward and eastward and a heavy swell running up the mainmast ship heading north north west by the wind at sundown took in sail had it more moderate then the night at daylight made sail and stood on to the northward latter part fine breezes saw killers and grampers 11 ends lat 25.46 long 44.44

Remarks on board Monday July the 12th

Coment with fine breezes from the eastward and fair weather clearing north at six o'clock we raised a gail ahead at sundown took in sail and kept to the wind heading north east had good weather then the night at daylight made sail and set off with a half past seven at raised a breeze up sail hoped to be blown nose grampers 20 ends lat 26.00 long 43.44

Remarks on board Tuesday July the 13th

Coment with fine breezes from the southward and good weather ship heading to the westward at sundown took in sail had it moderate then the night at daylight made sail and stood on to the westward had blackfish and four sails 20 ends

Remarks on board Wednesday July the 14th

Coment with fine breezes from south east and good weather ship heading down the gulf at sundown took in sail and kept to the wind heading south west latter part of the night the wind changed round off the north at daylight made sail and stood to the westward at ten o'clock at raised breezes to the windward but saw nothing more latter part light breezes 15 ends lat 25.20 long 44.52

Remarks on board Thursday July the 15th

Coment with light air from the northward and fair weather the watch employed towing down the winging at sundown took in sail had it calm latter part of the night got a breeze from south west at daylight made sail and stood to the northward and westward saw two whaling Barges and several merchant ships latter part fresh breezes 15 ends lat 25.40 long 46.20

Remarks on board Friday July the 16th

Coment with fresh breezes from the westward and fair weather at sundown took in sail had strong breezes latter part of the night made on to a gail at dawn at took in the foresail and was ship blowing a strong gail called the men down from aloft 20 ends no latitude

Remarks on board Saturday July the 17th

Coment with a gail from south west and a heavy sea coming ship heading to the eastward at sundown took in the mainloft sail blowing strong at midnight began to moderate at six at made sail had it more moderate latter part light breezes 20 ends heading to the northward and westward long lat 26.20 47.00

Remarks on board Sunday July the 18th

Coment with light breezes from north south west and fair weather ship heading to the eastward the watch at work setting up oxygen at sundown took in sail and kept to the wind to the southward latter part of the night made on to a moderate gail at dawn at took a sail steering to the eastward latter part blowing strong and rugged weather nothing in sight heading to the southward by the wind 15 ends lat 26.00 long 46.08
