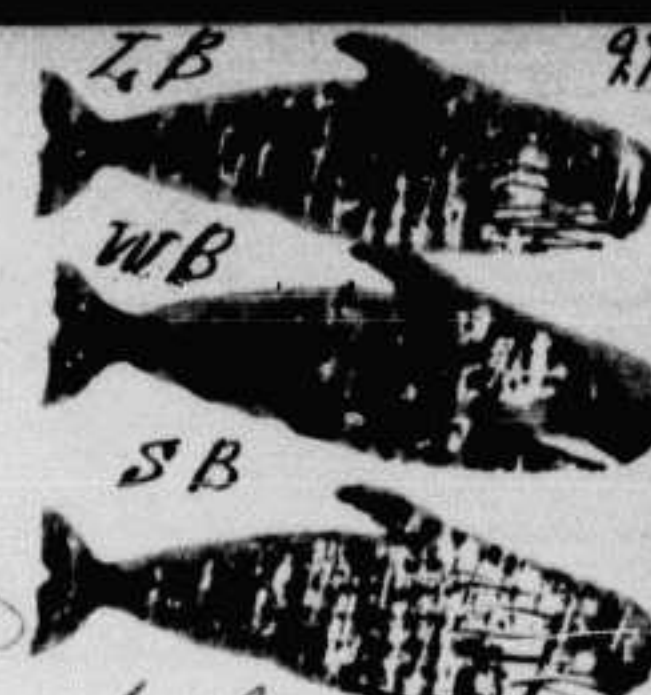
Remarks on board Monday August the 30th

Remarks on board Wednesday September the 1st

Comet with strong breezes from south east and rainy and squally with at sundown was ship to the south west Comet blowing a gail latter part blowing a gail and a heavy sea running so ends Lat 37° 05' Long 26° 38'

Remarks on board Thursday September the 2nd

Comet with a gail of wind from south east and raged with ship lying two and close aboard main topsail heading south west latter part of the night had it more moderate latter part more moderate but the foretopsail and foremast looked out the blackfish so ends Lat 37° 05' Long 26° 45'

Remarks on board Friday September the 3rd

Comet with fresh breezes from the eastward and squally with at sundown took in the foretopsail ship heading south east by south had strong breezes three the night at daylight set the foretopsail latter part strong breezes so ends Lat 36° 36' Long 25° 57'

Remarks on board Saturday September the 4th
