

Remarks on board Saturday May the 28th 1870

Comment with a gale from south west and
raged and squally with a few sails. The
top in the foremast and here the ship to be
the southern called the men down from deck
at sundown saw a bark steering to the eastward
middle more moderately at night the fore
topmast latter part strong breezes so ends
Lat 30.48 Long 75.15

Remarks on board Sunday May the 29th

Comment with strong breezes from south west
and ragged with squalls off north part of the
ship to the wind to the westward had a
squally with thunder and lightning and hail
through the night latter part blowing again
saw to merchant ships so ends
Lat 31.14 Long 76.27

Remarks on board Monday May the 30th

Comment with a gale of wind from south west and
ragged with a few sails. Had a squall from the
north and side out calm middle calm latter
part light breezes to sails in sight so ends
Lat 31.22 Long 76.30

Remarks on board Tuesday May the 31st Long 76.30

Comment with light breezes from the north and
fair with a few sails. The fly jib and maintop sail
square sail middle and latter part light
breezes so ends crossing in Charleston ground
Lat 31.16 Long 76.26

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 1st 1870 Long 76.26

SB - Comment with fine breezes from the eastward and
fair with a few sails. At sundown took in sail
had light breezes through the night at daylight
long for blockfish and the starboard boat
got one latter part light breezes so ends
Lat 31.32 Long 76.28

Remarks on board Thursday June the 2nd 1870

Comment with light breezes from the east and a fair
with a few sails. At sundown took in sail middle light breezes latter part
strong breezes and squally with boats out the blockfish
so ends
Lat 31.45 Long 76.40

Remarks on board Friday June the 3rd

Comment with strong breezes from the southward
and squally with a few sails. At sundown took in sail and
were ship to the eastward middle strong breezes latter
part thunder storm so ends
Lat 31.40 Long 76.46

Remarks on board Saturday June the 4th

Comment with a thunder squall and raining. Ellen
in torants at top of the island off
at side the Captain Henry came on
board from the Schooner. Ellen Boomer
had sun shades on in room south latter part
had a thunder squall so ends
Lat 31.40 Long 76.46

Remarks on board Sunday June the 5th

Comment with squalls and calm. At sundown
took in sail saw three sails middle and latter
part light breezes so ends nine sails in sight
Lat 30.58 Long 76.46

Remarks on board Monday June the 6th

Comment with light breezes and fair with
at sundown took in sail middle and latter
part fine breezes so ends
Lat 30.48 Long 75.80

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 7th

Comment with fine breezes and fair with a few
sails. At daylight steering defunct courses at sundown took
in sail at night raised spinnaker sails at daylight
and the starboard boat struck and the vessel went
downward eyes out took the whole to the ship. The
ship so ends
