Comment with a gale from north east and rugged weather saw a bark sailing to the westward middle and latter part more moderate heading to the north scenes Lat 37.28 Long 48.11

Remarks on board Tuesday August the 30th

Comment with strong breezes from north east and rugged weather middle and latter part more moderate heading to the northward and westward scenes Lat 38.11 Long 49.16

Remarks on board Wednesday August the 31st

Comment with fine breezes from north east and good weather broke out and had a squall and part of the day at sundown took in sail middle and latter part calm scenes

Remarks on board Thursday September the 1st 1870

Comment with good weather but calm middle and latter part the same scenes Lat 38.45 Long 50.08

Remarks on board Friday September the 2nd

Comment with fair weather but calm latter part light breezes scenes Lat 39.13

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Remarks on board Saturday September the 3rd 1870

Comment with light air and good weather at sundown took in sail middle and latter part fine breezes scenes Lat 40.07 Long 49.30

Remarks on board Sunday September the 4th

Comment with fine breezes from the eastward at sundown took in sail saw a sail to the north middle light squalls of rain at eight o'clock saw raised sperm whales going quick to windward toward the boats and the last one boat got fast and shot a bomb in to the whale and set it to smoking blew and threw in smoke and the last boat struck the whale scenes Lat 38.55



Remarks on board Monday September the 5th

Comment with fresh breezes at two o'clock took the whale to the ship and got ready and cut it in got through at nine o'clock parted and set the watch clear away the the head at nine o'clock at the starboard the works latter part strong breezes and rugged weather scenes Lat 40.13 Long 47.20

Remarks on board Tuesday September the 6th

Comment with strong breezes and rugged weather saw several sails at sundown took in the foretopsail had it rugged through the night at daylight whales all around the ship going quick to windward toward the ship and got right in a few moments saw one on board saw a bark to windward came in latter part strong breezes scenes Lat 39.41 Long 47.20
