

24 Remarks on board Wednesday September the 7th 1880

Comment with strong breezes and raged wither
at one o'clock it commenced raining and blowing
hard the whole booted at latter part the wind
hauled to the north and moderated so ends

Remarks on board Thursday September the 8th Long 46.19

Comment with moderate breezes and raged wither
saw a bark heeling to the windward middle and latter
part calm and a heavy swell rising so ends

Remarks on board Friday September the 9th

Comment with light breezes the northward and
fair wither but a heavy sea running shore down the
middle and latter part light breezes and a
heavy swell so ends Lat 40.24 Long 46.24

Remarks on board Saturday September the 10th

Comment with light breezes and a heavy swell heeling
the vessel in a wells all the time it sand can
look in sail saw a bark return of us at
daylight when whales all round the ship
all gathered round for them got with in
10 days of them several line but could not
get fair saw four boats from the bark William
Henry of Fairhaven but none got any at twelve
got on board again so ends

Remarks on board Sunday September the 11th

Comment with strong breezes and raged wither
at sundown blowing a gail ship heeling to the
right at nine o'clock called all hands to
take in the main topsail blowing a hurricane then
for four hours long and then moderated so ends
a till latter part more moderate so ends Lat 40.55

25- Remarks on board Monday September the 12th 1880

Comment with strong breezes and a heavy swell at the
main topsail and foresail at ten o'clock the boat
in the foresail and maintop sail blowing a gail
latter part blowing a strong gail and a heavy sea running
so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday September the 13th

Comment with a gail from the west and heavy
raged wither sent down the fore and main topsails
guards ship heading S.W. under fore topsail staysail and
main spancer middle and latter part blowing a
gail so ends Lat 40.02 Long 46.46

Remarks on board Wednesday September the 14th

Comment with a gail from the west and
raged and squally wither middle more moderate
at four o'clock it shifted off S.E. latter part
strong breezes and raged wither saw a gail
steering north east so ends Lat 42.00 Long 47.24

Remarks on board Thursday September the 15th

Comment with strong breezes from north west
and raged wither at three o'clock it raised sperm
whales four and the barbed and Starbuck
boat struck but the Starbuck boat lost her whale
by a shot one getting fast in the line and lost
both lines lost the other whale to the ship it sent
own and took in the fore topsail middle and
latter part blowing a gail and raged wither hooked into the
whale and held to it but had to let it go
saw a brig to the north so ends Lat 42.20
Long 49.08
