Cloudy weather strong breeze from S.E. on the wind on starboard tack there was 7 sails in sight today

Pleasant weather light breeze from S.E. on the wind heading 4 E by E. Baked flour & Bread and coopered it. picked up a large piece of hard pine timber then 5 sails in sight.

Pleasant weather light air on the starboard tack on the wind at day light caught the Bark Edward Ernst whaling this was 4 whale ships in sight we lowered so did all the other vessels the Ernst got fast and had her boat alongside by 10 o'clock our Starboard boat went on and put one line in which just forward his hump the whale took out a little line and the line drew the whale was going fast and when we lowered our chance was the worst of any starboard boat but all the rest of the boats.

Weather fine light air from the Eastern Brij Starboard got fast to a large whale which took his boat out of sight. 4 vessels Capt went aboard of the at sundown and his boat are now looking after the missing boat. at daylight breeze took her whale alongside
