Wednesday March 24th 1868.

Comences rough weather strong wind from S^W trying out repairing Starboard Boat. Blackfish in sight. today last part same finished trying out.

Thursday March 25th 1868.

Comences rough weather wind S^W spoke and gamed Rk. Stebbin Sultan of Salem, 9 months and 150 bbls of oil sent a note home to her she is bound for Calcutta. in hope in future and putting on canvas a boat in place of Starboard Boat. Last part weather the same on Starboard tack heading E & S. under double reef. the "Shibden Sultan" in sight.

Friday March 26th 1868.

Comences strong breeze from S^W rough weather a number of Sulphur bottom whales in sight. Last part gale from S^W.

Saturday March 27th 1868.

Comences strong gale from S^W ship lay to under close reef. Last part same nothing of account happened.

Sunday March 28th 1868.

Comences gale of wind from S^W laying to under close reef topsail & foresail. Last part weather moderating wind hauling to S^E. stowing down oil.

Monday March 29th 1868.

First part moderate breeze from S^E. hazy finished running down our oil at 5 o'clock P.M. Last part same mending Starboard boat.

Tuesday March 30th 1868.

Fine weather wind N^E. raised whales at 7 o'clock P.M. lowered and chased until dark without success. Last part fine weather light air from E^W 7 o'clock P.M. raised school of small whales going to wind fast lowered all boats and tried to cut them off but without success.

Wednesday March 31st 1868.

Fine weather light air from E^W lowered for blackfish captured 4. H.B. 2 W.B. 1 B.B. 1 mending boat repairing. Last part Calm. trying out Blackfish.

Sunday Mar. 22nd 1868.

Comences Calm Blackfish turned up 6 bls. Last part same nothing of account happened.

Monday March 23rd 1868.

Comences fine weather light air from N^W steering S^E. lowered for in back without success. at sundown shifted to wind and shortened sail on Starboard tack. Last part fine weather fresh breeze from N^W steering S^E. at 11 P.M. raised school of sperm whales lowered and chased up to them.

Tuesday March 24th 1868.

Weather fine strong breeze from N^W. at 2.30 Mate & 3rd Mate got fast Mate saved his whale took him alongside and had him on deck at dark. Landed Rk. Nigar Capt. Cleveland he had taken 45 bls since leaving port lost one Boatsteerer John Dagget. Vingers also had a so. Calhoun on deck taken today. Last part weather rough through the night strong wind and fair from daylight to N.

Wednesday March 25th 1868.

Weather Cloudy strong breeze from N^W. by sunset Nigar in sight lowered by trying out also. feel unwell. today last part strong breeze - Squally. trying out.

Thursday March 26th 1868.

Weather Cloudy strong wind from Westward and squally. one sail in sight. had a rain squall at 4 P.M. finished trying out at same time and cleared up. deck whale turned up 33 bls. Last part weather moderating heavy swell from N^W.

Friday 27th 1868.

Weather Cloudy fresh breeze from the N^W stowed down our oil there was one sail in sight. also started between decks & B. Blackfish. Last part gale from S^E. under short sea.

Saturday Mar. 28th 1868.

Weather Cloudy gale from S^E. mended mending machine nothing in sight. Last part same a number of Sulphur bottom whales in sight.
