

Monday May 9th 1870  
Commence. Cloudy weather employed in making bottom  
sent it up complete at 4.50 Pm.

Tuesday May 10th  
Weather fine moderate breeze from S<sup>2</sup> sent up  
spars & yards at the main & topmast & Schooner  
hazy & Masser arrived from Emerald City Capt.  
Codd on board. Schooner had taken 290 sperm.

Wednesday May 11th  
Fine weather moderate breeze from S<sup>2</sup>  
rigging ship taking on board water &c. At night  
rain in squalls. (Schooner sailed)

Thursday May 12th  
Fine weather until 7 Pm when it commenced to rain  
at ship & city one watch ashore, one sail  
in sight at sunset.

Friday May 13th  
Fine weather moderate trade slowed down water  
mended our ropes &c.

Saturday May 14th  
Commence fair get underway at 6 Am wind SSW  
steering N.W. at 10 changed course to N.S.W.

Sunday May 15th  
Lat 11.30 N  
Long 89.54 W Commence fine weather fresh breeze from SW steering  
N by W. Last part cloudy steering N by W

Monday May 16th  
Lat 14.00 N  
Long 79.42 W Commence Cloudy strong breeze from SW steering  
N by W light rain in squalls. Last part squally wind  
came out from the N<sup>2</sup> at 11 took double reef in fore  
under easy sail.

Tuesday May 17th 1870  
Lat 17.30 N  
Long 76.00 W Commence Cloudy weather wind to S<sup>2</sup> strong easterly  
sea under double reef topmast lowered for blackfish  
Lat 17.30 N WB 2 BB.1 LB.1 took them along side  
at 6 Pm. skinned them in first watch. Last part  
fine weather light air from N<sup>2</sup>. tried out blackfish  
traverse up 8 fls.

Wednesday May 18th  
Lat 16.00 N  
Long 79.04 W Commence cloudy strong breeze from N<sup>2</sup> steering NNW  
Last part same steering NNW

Thursday May 19th  
Observation Commence rainy weather with thunder wind from  
S<sup>2</sup> saw at 4 Pm a boat looked like land. Marine  
N.W. by N supposed to be Lake Malo. steering N by W. Last  
part gale of wind from S<sup>2</sup> with heavy rain layed  
to during the night made sail at 3 Am steering NNW  
sighted San Malo at 10. thick weather

Friday May 20th  
Commence gale of wind from S<sup>2</sup> at 2 Pm anchored  
in 38 fathoms to 60 fathoms to horse pile fog lit up  
at 3 Island of Rona bearing WNW distant 8 mile  
Last part gale from S<sup>2</sup> got underway at 10 Am. bound  
for Panama

Saturday May 21st  
Commence gale from S<sup>2</sup> anchored in 9 fathoms  
at 3.30 Pm. at Panama, the S. S. Paste Pancho  
was also anchored there, one ~~Spanish~~ had arrived  
washed ship mended sail received papers & L<sup>1</sup>  
from Wife washed anchor and anchored in  
near the town.

Sunday May 22nd  
Commence fine wind light from S<sup>2</sup> Last part same  
Starting up to anchor saw St. Thomas & Johnson  
Capt. Clerk on board U.S. Steamer. Track, Capt. Cook  
Drewet to cash.
