Thursday 3rd

Commences with moderate breezes from the east with fine pleasant weather ship by the wind heading S. E. crew imployed in various parts of ships duty one sail in sight saw Grampuses at sundown took in sail for the night Middle part light winds at daylight made all sail and tacked ship heading S. E. by E.

Commences with strong breezes from the E. by N. with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind heading S. E. by E. crew imployed in various parts of ships duty Middle and Latter part the same weather continues two sails in sight we think is a blubber hunter.

Commences with light winds and pleasant weather from the E. by E. heading S. E. two sail in sight crew imployed in various parts of ships duty at half past five P.M. gammed with the Barque Ohio Captain Howland. thirteen months out 1750 barrels of sperm oil at sundown took in sail for the night Middle and Latter part a calm three sails in sight so ends

Commences with a calm three sails in sight crew imployed setting up rigging at sundown took in sail for the night Middle part a calm Latter part a moderate breeze from the S. W. steering by the wind heading S. E. by E. four sails in sight so ends Lat Long

Commences with moderate breezes from the S. W. with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind heading S. E. by E. sail in sight at sundown

Mattapoisett Capt Tripp Master

took in sail for the night and tacked ship heading N. E. Middle and Latter part the same two sails in sight spawed Blackfish but did not catch any so ends

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant weather from the S. E. steering N. W. two sails in sight crew imployed in various parts of ships duty at sundown lowered two boats for Blackfish but did not catch any at sundown took in sail Middle part light winds with rain squalls from the S. E. Latter part light winds with pleasant steering N. W. so ends

Commences with light winds with fine pleasant weather from the S. steering N. W. crew imployed in various parts of ships duty at sundown took in sail for the night Middle and Latter parts continues the wind S. E. steering N. W. so ends Lat Long

Commences with light winds with pleasant weather from the S. E. steering by the wind heading E. N. E. crew imployed in various parts of ships duty caught a turtle at sundown took in sail for the night Middle and Latter part strong breezes three sails in sight tacked ship at N. E. by N. tacked again heading E. by N. so ends this day Lat Long

Friday 11th

Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind heading E. N. E. crew imployed in various parts of ships duty at 4 P.M. passed a large steamer steering to the N. and W. Middle and Latter part continues the same so ends Lat Long
