

Remarks on Board Bark

Saturday 12th

Commences with moderate breezes with fine weather from the S.E. heading E.S.E. crew employed in various parts of ship's duty Middle and Latter parts continue the same one sail in sight and picked up two planks so ends this day Lat Long

Sunday 13th

Commences with light breezes from the S.E. heading by the wind E.S.E. one sail in sight crew employed in various parts of ship's duty Middle part at light wind Latter part at calm one sail still in sight so ends Lat Long

Monday 14th

Commences with a calm one sail in sight at 2 P.M. sprang up a light breeze from the S.W. steering S.E. by E. caught four dolphins and several big fish at sundown took in sail for the night steering S.E. Middle part moderate and Latter part strong breezes and squally three merchantmen in sight so ends Lat Long

Tuesday 15th

Commences with strong breezes and cloudy weather from the S.W. steering S.E. crew employed in ship's work at 5 P.M. commenced raining at sundown took in sail for the night Middle part heavy rain squally lifted by the wind heading S. by E. Latter part strong winds and rugged weather ship under reefed topsails staysails and spencer so ends Lat Long

Wednesday 16th

Commences with strong winds with a heavy sea running assal under reefed topsails heading by the wind S.E.

wind S.W. by W. Middle part heavy rain squally Latter part the same saw several merchantmen steering eastward so ends the day Lat Long

Thursday 17th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S.W. free from rain vessel heading by the wind W.N.W. crew employed in various parts of ship's duty at sundown took in sail Middle part strong winds and squally weather Latter part the same wore ship heading S.E. Lat Long

Friday 18th

Commences with strong breezes free from squally wind from the S.W. heading by the wind S.E. crew employed on ship's duty Middle and Latter parts strong breezes and rugged weather tackled ship heading W.N.W. saw two Humpbacks going very fast one sail in sight so ends Lat Long

Saturday 19th

Commences with strong breezes and a heavy sea running from the S.W. steering by the wind heading W. by W. crew employed on ship's duty one sail in sight steering to the eastward Middle and Latter parts still blowing very hard from the W. by W. steering by the wind heading S. so ends Lat Long

Sunday 20th

Commences with a gale and a heavy sea running from the W. by N. ship under close reefed topsails staysails and spencer heading S. Middle part heavy squally at 12 O'clock wind shifted to the S.E. blowing heavy Latter part at daylight set the fore topsail and foresail and kept her S.W. by S. one sail in sight Lat Long
