

Remarks on Board Bark

Monday 21st

Commences with strong breeze and a heavy sea running from the N.E. ship steering S.W. by N. At 1 O'clock P.M. gun down and spoke the Rosa Baker of Boston Capt Gifford had seen no whales at sundown shortened sail and stood by the wind heading N.E. W. Middle and latter parts moderate weather steering N.E. W.

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant weather wind E. steering N. crew employed on ship duty see some sperm whale at sundown took in sail for the night Middle and latter parts light wind latter part the same. wind from the N. heading E. at 11 repairing the foretop sail so ends Lat Long

Wednesday 23rd

Commences with light wind from the N. with pleasant weather heading E. the wind S. S. W. crew employed in repairing and bending the foretop sail At 1 O'clock saw 2 hump back towards two boats and gave chase they were going so quick we did not get nigh them came on board Middle and latter parts continues the same so ends Lat Long

Thursday 24th

Commences with light winds from the N.E. W. with pleasant weather steering by the wind on different tack picked up a barrel of kerosene oil Middle and latter parts light winds and calms one brig in sight Lat Long

Friday 25th

Commences with light air and calms vessel steering N.E. W. At 1 O'clock P.M. exchanged Longitude with a Prussian Brig crew employed in various parts of ship duty Middle and latter parts continues the same one brig in sight Lat Long

Saturday 26th

Commences with light winds from the East with fine pleasant weather ship steering N. crew employed in various parts of ship duty Middle and latter parts continues the same Lat Long

34.39. 42.29

Sunday 27th

Commences with light winds from the N.E. with fine pleasant weather ship steering various courses crew employed at nothing for today is the Sabbath a day of rest for sailors as well as landmen one sail in sight at sundown took in sail for the night Middle and latter parts continues the same at 1 O'clock saw Killers lowered two boats and gave chase but did not succeed in striking any so ends this day Lat Long

Monday 28th

Commences with moderate breeze from the N.E. with fine pleasant weather steering different courses Eight Merchants in sight at sundown took in sail for the night kept her by the wind on the northern tack Middle and latter parts continues the same so ends this day Lat Long

Commences with light winds from the N.E. heading E.S.E. three sails in sight crew employed on ship duty middle and latter parts continues the same so ends two sails in sight Lat Long
