

Remarks on Board Bark
Wednesday 30th

Commences with light winds and calms
vessel cruising crew employed breaking
out the after hold saw Blackfish and
Herring one sail in sight middle part
light winds latter part at half
past five Olie L. Brightman raised
a school of sperm whales going very quick
At eight o'clock lowered two boats and
gave chase at 11 o'clock the Capt. came
down so ends

Thursday 31st

Commences with light winds and calms
the boats chased the whales till sun-
down but did not get near enough
to strike got on board at 9 o'clock
P.M. took in the light sail and set
the watch middle and latter part
light air and calms so ends

Commences with light air and calms
crew employed on ship's duty picked up
a plank and 2 tins of kerosene oil
at sundown took in sail for the night
Middle and latter part moderate
breezes from the North so ends

on different tacks crew employed on
ship's duty one brigg in sight middle
and latter part continues the same

sundown took in sail for the night
Middle and latter part light winds
one sail in sight so ends

Monday 4th

Commences with light winds from the
S.E. with pleasant weather at 4 o'clock
P.M. John Gonzales raised a large sperm
whale breaching 5 miles off lowered two
boats and gave chase did not see him from
the boat came on board and found that
another ship's boat had been chasing
them gave them up Middle and latter
part continues the same so ends this day

Tuesday 5th

Commences with light winds and calms
cruising on different tacks repairing the
waist-boat took in sail at sundown at
day light John Gonzales raised a school
of sperm whales going to the windward
Lowered two boats and gave chase so ends
no latitude

Wednesday 6th

Commences this day chasing whales at
half past five the Starboard boat
struck a large whale got stove but we got
the whale waist-boat fast and the
Starboard boat also got him along side at
1 o'clock we then got supper and set the watch
at day light commenced cutting squalls
weather so ends

Thursday 7th

Commences with strong breezes from the S.
with squalls still cutting at 6 o'clock got
the keel bailed and overboard at
10 o'clock started the work Middle
and latter part the weather the
same still a boiling and there is two
sails in sight so ends

S. with rain squalls still boiling Middle
and latter part continues the same
2 sails in sight so ends
