

Remarks on Board Bark

Wednesday 27th

Commenced with light winds from the S. W. and fine pleasant weather ship steering E. S. E. crew employed on ships duty Middle and latter part wind from the N. W. heading by the wind N. by W. and cruising on different tacks saw grasshoppers to day see them quite often so ends this day Lat Long

Thursday 28th

Commenced with light airs and calms from the S. W. ship steering by the wind heading S. half E. crew employed on various parts of ship duty Middle part calm latter part a very light breeze one sail in sight so ends Lat Long

Friday 29th

Commenced with light winds from the S. W. and pleasant weather vessel steering E. S. E. a merchant brigain sight at 12 O'clock Captain went on board examining it was an Englishman but it turned out to be a station did not stay but a short time returned at 3 O'clock P.M. not much the wiser Middle part weather the same latter part strong breeze from the S. W. ship cruising on different tacks saw five sails so ends Lat Long

Saturday 30th

Commenced with a strong breeze from the S. W. ship first on one tack and then on the other crew employed on various parts of ship duty saw a large white whale about six miles to windward at sundown took in sail for the night saw three whaleships to day but did not reach any of them Middle and latter part wind and weather the same with a heavy sea running vessel steering E. by S. so ends Lat Long

Sunday 31st

Commenced with a very strong breeze from the S. W. and a heavy sea running vessel steering a course heading E. by S. bound for the Island of know where Middle part very heavy squalls with plenty of rain latter part more moderate shifted her course to E. by S. nothing in sight so ends this day Lat Long

Monday 1st of September

Commenced today with strong winds from the S. W. with a heavy sea running and rain squalls vessel steering E. by S. crew employed on various parts of ship duty At dark saw something turn flukes alongside of the ship that looked very much like a sperm whale but it was too dark to be positive of it Middle part more moderate and latter part light winds but cloudy weather changed her course to E. S. E. nothing in sight but one sail so ends Lat Long

Tuesday 2nd

Commenced with strong breeze from the westward ship steering E. by S. crew employed on ship duty At 3 O'clock wind shifted around into the N. E. vessel on the wind heading E. S. E. Middle part wind the same with rain squalls latter part wind more moderate one sail in sight so ends

Wednesday 3rd

Commenced with a moderate breeze from the N. E. ship heading by the wind E. S. E. crew employed on ships duty At half past 12 O'clock hauled ship heading N. by E. At dark took the light sail Middle and latter part strong breeze from the same quarter so ends this day
