

Remarks on Board Barque

Saturday 4th

Commence with light breeze from the N.E. the vessel steering a course heading S. by W. the weather is pleasant crew employed on ship's duty expect to sight the peak of Teneriffe tomorrow Middle part Middle and Latter part wind and weather the same sighted some rocks that lies about 100 miles to the windward of Teneriffe nothing more so ends this day

Sunday 5th

Commence with a light breeze from the N.E. and fine pleasant weather vessel steering S. crew employed sorting over potatoes Cooper employed setting up shovels saw two sails both merchantmen At 4 O'clock P.M. raised the Island of Teneriffe 3 points of our star board bow and 60 miles off Middle part light winds and pleasant weather Latter part wind and weather the same At half past 11 O'clock A.M. come to an anchor in the harbor of Teneriffe pulled the sails and got dinner it is Sunday and is the sailor resting day so ends this day

Monday 6th

Commence today lying to anchor in the harbor of Teneriffe set the watches for the night and turned in to snore to dream of the lovely angels ashore and nothing more At 6 O'clock P.M. the Spanish steamer arrived and let go mudhook Middle and Latter part light winds breaking out the hole and cooping all the Flour and Breast casks and getting ready to stow water so ends this day

Narrative of Trip Master

Thursday 7th

Commence today with a light breeze from the N. vessel lying to anchor crew employed breaking out the hole wishing in these hours that they could get ashore At sundown Captain came on board for the night set the watches and went below for the night Middle part & Latter part weather the same At 8 O'clock A.M. brought the water boat alongside and filled 38 casks so ends

Wednesday 8th

Commence today crew employed stowing off the hole and taring down At 5 O'clock the Cooper and two of the Boats there went ashore on a run for the night returned At 5 O'clock in the morning and all went merry as a marriage bell in the night two of the foremast hands swam ashore and shared out Latter part finished stowing off and taring so ends this day

Thursday 9th

Commence today with crew employed washing ship inside and outside also painting the fore & main & mizen chains cleared up the decks and washed off Middle part Captain and 3rd Mate stood the watches for the night was afraid some more of crew would run away some time in the night a Spanish steamer arrived and dropped anchor so ends this day

Friday 10th

Commence today with a strong breeze from the N.E. still lying to anchor At 3 O'clock P.M. hove up anchor and bid farewell to Teneriffe the Captain brought a playmate aboard in the shape of a poodle dog Middle and Latter part wind and weather the same ship steering S. found south of the line to another whaling ground so ends this day
