

Remarks on Board Barque

Tuesday 18th

Commenced today with a moderate breeze from the S. E. vessel steering S. by E. crew employed painting the barboard boat and others on ships duty Middle part steering S. by E. At 9 o'clock p.m. raised the rocks of St. Paul about half a mile to windward Latter part wind and weather the same so ends this day
Wednesday 19th

Commenced today with a strong breeze from the S. E. vessel steering S. by E. with pleasant weather crew employed on ships duty saw Black fish but did not lower for them at sundown latched ship and kept her by the wind on the Starboard side Middle and Latter parts wind and weather the same one sail in sight so ends this day

Thursday 20th

Commenced today with a strong breeze from the S. E. vessel by the wind heading S. by E. crew employed on ships duty Middle and Latter parts wind and weather the same nothing in sight today so ends this day

Friday 21st

Commenced today with a moderate breeze from the S. E. vessel by the wind on the port tack crew employed on ships duty today the Captain hung a twenty one pound box of Tobacco up in under the house and told all hands that the man that could take it down beside 42.50 in gold Middle part wind and weather the same Latter part a stronger breeze from the same direction at 11 o'clock A.M. sighted the Island of Ferdinand located in Latitude 3.53 S. and Longitude 32.25 West. saw no more so ends this day

Commenced today with a strong breeze from the S. E. vessel steering S. by E. and pleasant weather crew employed on ships duty saw porpoise Middle and Latter wind and weather the same one sail in sight so ends this day
Sunday 23rd

Commenced today with a moderate breeze from the S. E. vessel steering S. by E. crew employed on ships duty killed a small hoy today and expect to have a fresh pork dinner tomorrow Middle part saw a large ship steering to the south east Latter part wind and weather the same two sails in sight so ends this day

Monday 24th

Commenced today with a moderate breeze from the S. E. vessel steering S. by E. with fine pleasant weather crew employed on different parts of ships duty two sails in sight Middle and Latter parts wind and weather the same so ends this day

Tuesday 25th

Commenced today with a moderate breeze from the S. E. vessel by the wind heading S. by E. by the vessel employed on ships duty saw some things a hatching and white water but could not make out what it was supposed it was grasshoppers or fire-back Middle and Latter parts light winds and calms saw one finch and a sail so ends this day

Wednesday 26th

Commenced today with light airs & calms from all quarters of the globe vessel steering S. by E. when the wind is fair Middle part variable winds with rain squalls vessel steering S. by E. Latter part wind and weather the same
