Monday 29th

Commences today with a moderate breeze from the N.E. vessel steering S.W. crew employed on ships duty at 10 o'clock P.M. commenced the Barque Staggered C. Thompson Master saw grampusses at sundown took in sail for the night at 10 o'clock and latter part wind and weather the same saw one sail so ends this day

Tuesday 30th

Commences today with a light breeze from the N.E. vessel steering different courses crew employed on ships duty at sundown took in sail for the night and luffed to the wind on the port tack at 10 o'clock and latter part strong breeze from the N.E. vessel steering S.W. saw one sail so ends this day

Wednesday 31st

Commences today with a moderate breeze from the N.E. vessel steering N. by E. crew employed on different parts of ships duty at sundown took in sail for the night saw grampusses breaching at 10 o'clock and latter part wind and weather the same at daylight made sail and kept her West saw one sail so ends this day

Thursday 1st of January 1874

Commences today with moderate breeze from the N.E. vessel by the wind with fine pleasant weather crew employed on ships duty at sundown took in sail for the night at 10 o'clock and latter part wind and weather the same saw one sail grampusses and cow fish so ends this day

Friday 2nd

Commences today with a moderate breeze from the N.E. vessel steering West with fine weather crew employed on various parts of ships duty at sundown took in sail for the night at 10 o'clock and latter part strong breeze from the N.E. vessel steering S.W. saw three sails so ends this day

Saturday 3rd

Commences today with a moderate breeze from the N.E. vessel steering S.W. with fine weather crew employed on ships duty at sundown took in sail for the night and luffed to the wind on the starboard tack at 10 o'clock and latter part wind and weather the same at 10 o'clock kept her off S.W. saw porpoises and nothing more so ends this day

Sunday 4th

Commences today with a moderate breeze from the N.E. vessel by the wind with fine weather crew employed on ships duty at sundown took in sail for the night at 10 o'clock and latter part strong breeze from the same quarter sail nothing so ends this day

Monday 5th

Commences today with a strong breeze from the N.E. vessel by the wind crew employed on ships duty at sundown took in sail for the night at 10 o'clock and latter part wind and weather the same at 10 o'clock at P.M. Orlando F. Tripp Master, raised a school of sperm whales going to windward made all the sail the ship could carry and commenced beating to windward after them saw one sail so ends this day
