Thursday 26th

Commences today with a moderate breeze from the E. vessel by the wind heading N. E. crew employed cleaning the Topsail sheets and on ships duty saw one sail bound to the shore also saw porpoises & Middle part wind the same with rain squalls Latter part variable winds with much rain plenty of ships jacks and cabbages around saw a sail so ends this day

Friday 27th

Commences today with variable wind vessel by the wind heading N. W. by E. crew employed on ships duty Middle and Latter part light air and calms from different quarters saw porpoises and nothing more so ends this day Lat 00.30. S Long 30.31. W

Saturday 28th

Commences today with a light breeze from the E. by E. vessel by the wind on the Starboard tack crew employed on ships duty and broke out a new main top gallant sail and sent it and put up the old one foreward saw one sail steering to the south west ward also a school of dolphins Middle and Latter part light air and calms from different quarters saw Blackfish lowered three boats the waist & starboard boats got one apiece saw nothing more so ends this day

Sunday 1st of March

Commences today with a very light air from the N. E. by E. vessel by the wind heading N. W. by E. crew employed on ships duty and working on the Black fish one sail in sight Middle and Latter part light air and calms from all quarters saw a backer so ends this day

Commences today with light air and calms & rain squalls from different quarters vessel steering N. E. crew employed on ships duty saw porpoises & one sail Middle part a dead calm Latter part a light breeze from the N. E. vessel heading N. E. W. four sails in sight saw grampuses so ends this day

Tuesday 3rd

Commences today with a light breeze from the N. E. with fine pleasant weather vessel by the wind heading N. E. W. crew employed trying out the Black fish blubber and on ships duty four sails in sight Middle and Latter part wind and weather the same at daylight saw a school of Black fish but did not lower for them so ends this day Lat 01.00. N Long 31.23.

Wednesday 4th

Commences today with a light breeze from the Eastward vessel by the wind on the Starboard tack at 3 o'clock P.M. wind shifted into the N. W. tacked ship and steered a course N. E. by N. weather quite squally crew employed on ships duty saw two sails Middle and Latter part wind from the N. E. vessel by the wind saw nothing so ends this day
