

Remarks on Board Barge

Sunday 22nd

Commences today with a strong breeze from the N.E. with pleasant weather vessel steering N. half N. crew employed on different parts of ship's duty we are within about three hundred miles of Barbados Middle and Latter parts wind and weather the same so ends this day

Monday 23rd

Commences today with a strong breeze from the N.E. with pleasant weather vessel steering N. crew employed on ship's duty Middle & Latter parts a light breeze from the same quarter At half past 11 O'clock p.m. sight the Island of Barbados and at 8 O'clock A.M. come to an anchor in the harbor of Bridgetown furl the sails and cleared the decks so ends this day

Tuesday 24th

Commences today lying at anchor crew employed washing the inside of the ship and outside Middle part set the watches for the night Latter part crew employed painting ship inside and outside so ends this day

Wednesday 25th

Commences today still a painting ship at 6 O'clock p.m. the Starboard watch went ashore for twenty-four hours liberty Middle part the same as the night before Latter part still painting so ends this day

Thursday 26th

Commences today still painting ship at 5 O'clock the Starboard watch returned and the Port watch went ashore for the same length of time Middle part the same Latter part finished painting so ends this day

Friday 27th

Commences today lying at anchor doing not much of anything At 5 O'clock P.M. the Port watch returned on board and the Starboard watch went ashore again Middle and Latter parts the same so ends this day

Saturday 28th

Commences today lying at anchor employed taking provisions aboard the Starboard watch returned aboard & the Port watch went ashore Middle and Latter parts the same so ends this day

Sunday 29th

Commences today lying at anchor employed at various things too numerous to mention At dark the Port watch returned on board Middle & Latter parts the same so ends this day

Monday 30th

Commences today with the vessel still lying at anchor employed doing nothing Middle & Latter parts the same fine Steamers and a man of war lying to an anchor here so ends this day
