

Remarks on Board Barque

Friday 7th

Commences today with a light breeze from the E. & E. with pleasant weather vessel by the wind on different tacks at sundown took in sail for the night Middle & Latter parts the same at day light called all hands & commenced stowing down the oil saw one sail so ends this day

Saturday 8th

Commences today with a light breeze from the E. & E. with fine pleasant weather vessel by the wind finished stowing oil & cleared up the ship at sundown took in sail for the night Middle & Latter parts the wind & weather the same vessel steering to the North at twelve O'clock this day ends

Sunday 9th

Commences today with a light breeze from the Eastward with fine pleasant weather vessel by the wind on different tacks six sails in sight two merchantmen & four whalers saw grampuses breaching at sundown took in sail for the night Middle & Latter parts a moderate breeze from the N. so ends this day

Monday 10th

Commences today with a moderate breeze from the N. with cloudy weather vessel by the wind on different tacks four whalers in sight one schooner & three bargues at 4 O'clock P.M. gannet with the Charls W. Morgan she had taken 118 barrels of sperm oil since we saw her last Middle and latter parts wind from the E vessel steering different courses saw grampuses breaching so ends this day

Tuesday 11th

Commences today with a moderate breeze from the E. with fine pleasant weather vessel steering different courses saw porpoises & a number of merchantmen at sundown luffed to the wind & took in the light sail for the night Middle part wind & weather the same Latter part the same saw grampuses so ends this day

Wednesday 12th

Commences today with a light breeze from the E. with pleasant weather vessel by the wind on different tacks saw 3 sails & porpoises at sundown took in sail for the night Middle & Latter parts a moderate breeze from the same quarter saw a number of merchantmen & one whaler so ends this day

Thursday 13th

Commences today with a light breeze from the E. & E. with fine pleasant weather vessel steering different courses crew employed on ship's duty saw 6 sails five merchantmen & one whaler also saw a school of Blackfish at sundown took in the light sail for the night Middle part the wind the same with light rain squalls Latter part fine weather spoke the Barque Cisero of New Bedford three months out with no oil saw three others sails & a school of killers so ends this day

Friday 14th

Commences today with a light breeze from the S. E. with pleasant weather vessel by the wind on different tacks at 6 O'clock P.M. gannet with the Barque Cisero returned on board at 9 O'clock P.M. at sundown took in the light sails for the night Middle & Latter parts a moderate breeze from the same quarter so ends this day
