

Aug 12th 1880

First & middle part
light and baffling winds big
between Barnaboth & Court, Est-
Latter thick snow storm at 3. am
struck a sudden & heavy gale
from S.E. ship to sea 21 starting
Store Bulwark on Starboard side
& Lost figger head, at day
light I put away for Orange
Harbour off West End of
Walstone Island passed a
rock

Aug 13th at 3 p.m. came to anchor
in Orange Harbour in 15 fathoms
water 145 fath chain shot
60 bar of Casks to make room
for wood sent down for tea
gallant sail yard & mast
got 3 boat load of wood
Wind S.E. & squally

Aug 14th Strong breezes from the
East & with snow squalls crew
and carpenters employed in repair-
ing damage got 3 boat load
of wood took in cutting stage

Aug 15th Variable wind with snow
and fog.

Aug 16 Blowing a heavy S.E. Gale
with thick snow storm

Aug 17 Strong breezes from S.E. to S.W.
thick snow storm

Aug 18th First & middle part strong
breezes from south & S. Latter
part W. at 4 am took the
anchor & started for Court Islands
skirting S.E.

Aug 19th at 2 p.m. passed Genoa Cove
and at 4 came to anchor in
Genoa Cove in 24 fathoms water
at low tide, at day light here
up & anchored again in 4 fathoms

Aug 20th

Still at anchor in Genoa Cove, heavy
gale from N.W. both anchors ahead, thick
snow storm, severe

Aug 21st

gale with heavy snow still contin-
ues ship riding by both anchors

Aug 22nd

First & middle part wind W. at 11 am
& more moderate at 7 am Calm Took 2 anchors
here short on port Good sails sounded
out S.E. pass found after passing 2 fath
bank 4 & 5 fath water at 9 light air, all
sky overcast & threatening pulled sails &
gave more chain Latter part wind strong
from N.W.

Aug 23rd

First part light air
from N.W. & thick at 7 am took the
anchor & started out the S.E. passage wind
died out with a head sea setting in Genoa
Cove & towed back to anchor took 15 fath
for repairs

Aug 24th

First part calm at 4 am
Took the anchor & towed the ship
out with 3 boats left her between
New & Luff Isles and started to pull
to Court rocks, at noon got a light breeze
at 2 p.m. strong wind S.W. at 4 p.m.
boats came on board reported few seal
got 21 wind increasing to gale ran in
to Genoa Cove came to anchor with both
anchors at 6 p.m. & pulled sails

Aug 25th

Gale from south to S.E.
bore up anchor & dropped in further
Latter part gale to N.W. sent
down main top mast got boat
load of wood

Aug 26th

Gale from N.W. got wood & brass
sails, not quite equal to Clambs as they
form the principal food of the Cape
horn Indians

Aug 27th

Gale from N.W. at 8 p.m.
schooner H. M. Higgins of New London
Capt Rodgers came to anchor here 10
day from home
