

Nov 23rd 1881 Wind variable. passed the
ferson Isles ran close along them
Looking for seal skin. Saw skad
over for New Zealand. Landed part
of ship to anchor in Port XXIV
Ship Harbour

Nov 24th Halted all hands to get water.
Men refused to turn to until 6.
so got breakfast and start at 6.
men on shore for letters got none

Nov 25th Strong westerly winds got two raft
of water

Nov 26th Strong S.W. winds got one raft of
water and stuck the hold

Nov 27th Strong S.W. gale both anchors ahead

Nov 28th Strong S.W. gale. Brig started across
Nov 29th Wind was moderate till 6 a.m. gave more than
halted all hand to get underway
When badger Carbery Mr. Nixon
Asa Williams J. M. Blackman
Mr. Whit, seimur, J. M. Blackman
J. M. Blackman Paul Midon refused
to get the anchor. Halted them
& enquired their reason for refusing
some said they were for sealing & not
whaling, others that they shipped
for whaling and not sealing others
that they only shipped for two
months & food's reason. tried to
reason with them but no use. put them
in line with their hands behind
them & made them fast in a standing
position in about 20 minutes all
were willing to go to work. except
badger Carbery who had made up
his mind to keep in & run as he
had threatened to take my life
in 2 moments after being hit and
took the starboard anchor & in doing
so broke the starboard wooden rigger
wind. Cried in to S.W. with
squalls and rain. concluded not
to go to sea today

Nov 30th

First part went under way, wind
S.W. & stuck out to the N. by N. by
Island. Wind hauled W. & rain
ish with rain could not get out
so came back and anchored in Targe
Harbour latter part being S.W. gale

Dec 1st S.W. gale with heavy squalls

Dec 2nd First part Strong westerly winds
got under way and stuck out to the
N. by N. by Island, passing inside the ferson, passed
Casca Island, Brig heading along
the land to East

Dec 3rd moderate Breeze from the N.W. Cape
permeated passing S. by 10 miles
Latter part. arrived at 5 P.M. came
to anchor in port Stanley Harbour
boat came off from Mr. Brown and
brought letters, good.

Dec 4th Strong westerly winds. three ships
impure repairing one. Brown deck began
broke down of Cape Horn. One other
wrecker ship guano loaded bound
to London. sailing had had thrown
part of her cargo over board
John Rogers Carbery on shore to
the police court. gave him three
6 weeks in jail using threatening
language and refusal of duty. it
New Island. head to pay 1/6 pence
per day for his lord. & he to be put
to hard labour. double pay for the
government. they knew it.

Dec 5th fine weather. went on shore to get a
windless nipper. did not find one to suit
took the cold one on shore & got it
plated with rat iron strips. fed 6.
head, mutton. 3 sack potatoes.

Dec 6th gales N.E. Took Robinson on
shore to see the doctor pronounced
him slightly Rheumatic got medicine
for him at 5 P.M. saw him dead
have not seen him since and do not
know
